

The Sermon The Nicene Creed

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light,
true God from true God,
begotten, not made,
of one Being with the Father.
Through him all things were made.
For us and for our salvation
he came down from heaven:
by the power of the Holy Spirit
he became incarnate from the Virgin Mary,
and was made man.

For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate;

he suffered death and was buried.

On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven

and is seated at the right hand of the Father.

He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son.

THE CONCLUSION OF OUR PASTORAL RELATIONSHIP WITH FR. VICTOR

In 2006, I was inducted by Bishop Smith as Rector St. Stephen's church. I have, with God's help, and to the best of my abilities, exercised this trust, accepting the privileges and responsibilities. After prayer and careful consideration, the time has come for me to leave this responsibility and I publicly state that my tenure as rector of

St. Stephen's ends this day. I will be moving to New York, with my wife Rhonda, and continue searching for a new calling in the service of God and the Episcopal Church.

Sr. Warden: As your Senior Warden, I have ecclesiastical responsibility until my tenure ends, at the Annual Meeting in January 2018 when a new Senior Warden will be appointed who will continue through the calling of a new rector for this church.

In the meantime, a meeting will be held for the Vestry this coming week with the Rev. Megen Traquair, Canon for the Ordinary, to discuss and explain the Transition process. I am in the process of searching for supply clergy to distribute Holy Eucharist. In the meantime, our Lay Eucharistic Ministers will be also leading morning/evening prayer on the weekends. The Diocese will recommend an interim for our vestry to interview and hire.

Eventually, a search committee will be formed and in time, God will send us the next correct rector for us. As sad as it is to have to say farewell to Fr. Vic, I am very happy to know he and Rhonda will be together again. It has been my pleasure to work with him on the liturgy and in all other aspects of his work here.

I wish him the best and pray that God will soon reveal his next ministry.

FR. DONNE leads Fr. Vic and congregation in prayer:

God, you have bound us together for a time as priest and people to work for the advancement of your kingdom in this place: We give you humble and hearty thanks for the ministry which we have shared in these past 11 years.

Celebrant:

We praise you and we bless you, holy and gracious God, source of life abundant. From before time you made ready the creation. Your Spirit moved over the deep and brought all things into being: sun, moon, and stars; earth, winds, and waters; and every living thing. You made us in your image, and taught us to walk in your ways. But we rebelled against you, and wandered far away; and yet, as a mother cares for her children, you would not forget us. Time and again you called us to live in the fullness of your love. And so this day we join with Saints and Angels in the chorus of praise that rings through eternity, lifting our voices to magnify you as we sing (say):

The people stand or kneel.

The Celebrant continues

Glory and honor and praise to you, holy and living God. To deliver us from the power of sin and death and to reveal the riches of your grace, you looked with favor upon Mary, your willing servant, that she might conceive and bear a son, Jesus the holy child of God. Living among us, Jesus loved us. He broke bread with outcasts and sinners, healed the sick, and proclaimed good news to the poor. He yearned to draw all the world to himself yet we were heedless of his call to walk in love. Then, the time came for him to complete upon the cross the sacrifice of his life, and to be glorified by you.

On the night before he died for us, Jesus was at table with his friends. He took bread, gave thanks to you, broke it, and gave it to them, and said: "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

As supper was ending, Jesus took the cup of wine. Again, he gave thanks to you, gave it to them, and said: "Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is poured out for you and for all for

the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

Now gathered at your table, O God of all creation, and remembering Christ, crucified and risen, who was and is and is to come, we offer to you our gifts of bread and wine, and ourselves, a living sacrifice.

Pour out your Spirit upon these gifts that they may be the Body and Blood of Christ. Breathe your Spirit over the whole earth and make us your new creation, the Body of Christ given for the world you have made. In the fullness of time bring us, with Sts. Stephen, Barbara, Andrew and all your saints, from every tribe and language and people and nation, to feast at the banquet prepared from the foundation of the world.

Through Christ and with Christ and in Christ, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, to you be honor, glory, and praise,

forever and ever.

The Bread and the Cup are given to the communicants with these words The Body of Christ, the bread of heaven. [Amen.] The Blood of Christ, the cup of salvation. [Amen.] **Communion Hymn** (See inside of front cover for Hymn number)

After Communion, the Celebrant says: Let us pray. Celebrant and People:
