• St. Stephen's Vestry has now accepted Rev. Ellen Morell as our Supply Priest. Rev. Ellen will be with us beginning October 8 to celebrate Holy Eucharist at the 10:30AM service. She will be here all 4 weekends of the month. However, Holy Eucharist will be offered only at 10:30AM 10/8 and 10/29. The weekends of 10/14 and 10/21, she will celebrate Eucharist at all 3 services. Rev. Ellen was ordained in 2003 in Indiana. She worked there as an Associate priest for 5 years. While still there, she was a mentor for Education for Ministry in a women's prison.
