#### FROM THE INTERIM RECTOR

Do you ever wonder why we say some of the things we say in an Episcopalian service? For example, what is the Collect of the Day? Isn't "collect" a verb, and why does a particular day need to collect something? And if we're really paying attention, we notice that every Sunday has a different one of these things. What's up with that?

The noun "collect," pronounced with the accent on the first syllable, is the same word as the verb used in the sentence, "I'm going to collect my things and leave now." It comes from Latin and means "gather together." At the beginning of most Episcopal services, it can be hard for some worshipers to quiet down. Others may be praying their own personal prayers. The initial prayer "collects" both the noisy and the quiet people and their prayers, and offers them up to God all collected together – hence the prayer came to be called the collect. As time went on, prayers to end any series of prayers, such as the prayers of the people, were called collects.

Collects have a typical structure. Although books on church liturgy provide detailed descriptions of the structure, I like my liturgy professor's definition best:

- First, let God know you think he's wonderful
- Second, ask God for something important
- Third, remind God how great you think he is

Proper 19 (what's a Proper? Wait until next month!) is a good example:

- O God, because without you we are not able to please you (= you're wonderful, God)
- Mercifully grant that your Holy Spirit may in all things direct and rule our hearts (= request)
- Through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever
- (= aren't you great!)

Collects have been written since the 600s. The collects for Lent all date from around 800, except for the collect on the fourth Sunday in Lent, which was written in 1952! Many congregations write their own prayers of the people with closing collects. Perhaps we could do the same at St Stephen's?
