Rector Search Update

The Search Committee for a Rector has been meeting since March 25th. Members include Tim Ash, Erin Bennett, Bill Brunell, Priscella Burrows, Carol Dockter (nonvoting member as Senior Warden), Tim Holsonback, Wendy Kulp, MJ Mahland, Fred Orman, Mindy Saunders, Rosemary Snapp and Jeff Speers. They have met four times to first of all review the results of the Day of Discovery Questionaire. Secondly, they had a Video Conference call from Rev. Megan Traquair, Canon for the Ordinary who is our Diocesan Representative. Her guidance during this process has been very helpful. There are two imminent projects to be completed during the next couple of months. One is the Parish Portfolio that includes basic information about our church and will be posted on the Diocesan website. The other is the Parish Profile that will be posted on our website. The Profile will include pictures and descriptions of St. Stephen's and of our community at large. The foundation for both of these documents comes from the information we gleaned from the Day of Discovery Questionaire. The first goal is to have the Portfolio completed by the May 20th Vestry Meeting. The Vestry will need to approve it and then it will be submitted to the Diocese for posting. Our focus will turn to the Profile and the committee hopes to have it completed soon after the Portfolio is done. With these two documents completed they hope to hear from interested candidates. Then, the work of preparing for interviews will be the focus of their meetings. Please keep them in your prayers during this time.
