

Allison's Story in Her Own Words...

I was raised on the East Coast, living in Greensboro, NC; White Plains, NY; Nashville, TN; Richmond, V A; and Northern VA between 1963-2007. Most of my time was in Virginia where I finished high sch ool in 1981, graduated with a BA in Geography from Mary Washington College in 1985, and worked for the Department of Defense as a Geospatial Intelligence Analyst and Staff Officer for 20 years.

I left government service in 2005 to switch careers and become a French teacher, and that eventually led to a different kind of teaching in a call to the priesthood. My ordination process began in Los A ngeles in 2009 and I was ordained a priest in January 2015. My first ministry as a clergy person was as a Chaplain Resident at the Veterans Administration Hospital in San Diego for a year.

Upon completion of that year, my wife Robin and I moved to Arizona in September 2015. The Diocese a sked me to serve as Interim Vicar for All Saints Episcopal Church in Safford, AZ starting January 2016. I completed that ministry at the end of August 2017. I next accepted a call to interim Vicar for St. Raph ael in the Valley, Benson, AZ.

My ministry and formation over the years has been in many different types of churches. I have been active in large program sized churches, a brand-new church plant, suburban churches, downtown churches, and rural churches. Two of my churches had Episcopal-Lutheran congregations.

Outside church life, my wife, Robin, and I have been together since December 2002. We had a commitment ceremony in 2004 and were legally married on our 10th anniversary in 2014. We live in Sierra Vista with two dogs and three cats.
