(All remain standing. Bishop greets the community)

Bishop: The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, and the love of God, and the fel-

lowship of the Holy Spirit, be with you all.

People: And also with you

Church Wardens: Bishop Smith and Bishop-elect Reddall, we have come together

today to welcome the Rev. Allison Cornell who has been chosen to serve as Rector of St. Stephen's Church. We believe that she is well qualified and that she has been prayerfully and law-

fully selected.

(The bishop reads the Letter of Institution aloud to the congregation)

Bishop Allison, do you, in the presence of this congregation, commit yourself

to this new trust and responsibility?

New Minister: I do.

Bishop: My brothers and sisters in Christ, Allison Cornell has been chosen to

be the priest and pastor of this parish of St. Stephen's, and she has

accepted this responsibility.

After prayerful consideration,

and according to the practice of this diocese,

I have appointed Allison to this position of leadership

in our common ministry.

This ministry continues the good work done through the years in this community,

and is part of the work and witness of the whole church.

It is a new beginning because Allison brings her particular gifts

to our ministry together.

Bishop: (to the members of St. Stephen's) Do you, the people of St. Stephen's

Church, commit yourselves to share with Allison in the ministry of

this parish?

People: We do.

Bishop: (to the visitors, guests, colleagues of the new minister) As brothers and sisters

in the Body of Christ, will you support Allison and the parish of St.

Stephen's in their ministry together?

People: We will.

Bishop: As we stand in God's presence let us pray that grace will be given to

Allison and to all of us in this ministry, that we may fulfill the respon-

sibilities which are ours.

(people sit, kneel, or stand for the prayers)

Leader: For the holy Church of God, that it may be filled with truth and love

and be found without fault at the Day of your coming, we pray to you

O Lord.

People: Lord, hear our prayer.

For all members of your Church in their vocation and ministry, that they may serve you in a true and godly life, we pray to you O Lord.

Lord hear our prayer.

For Kirk, our Bishop, Jennifer, our Bishop-elect, and for all bishops, priest, and deacons, that they may be filled with your love, may hunger for truth, and may thirst after righteousness, we pray to you O Lord.

Lord, hear our prayer.

For Allison, chosen priest in your church, we pray to you O Lord.

Lord hear our prayer.

That she may faithfully fulfill the duties of this ministry, build up your church, and glorify your name, we pray to you O Lord.

Lord hear our prayer.

Leader: That by the indwelling of the Holy Spirit she may be sustained and

encouraged to persevere to the end, we pray to you O Lord.

Lord, hear our prayer.

Leader: For Robin, her wife and for all her family, that they may be adorned

with all Christian virtues, we pray to you O Lord.

Lord, hear our prayer.

Bishop: The Lord be with you.

People: And also with you.

Bishop: Let us pray: Ever-living God, strengthen and sustain Allison, that with

patience and understanding she may love and care for your people, and grant that together they may follow Jesus Christ, offering to you their gifts and talents: through him who lives and reigns with you and

the Holy Spirit, one God, forever and ever. **Amen.**


(Please be seated for the readings)

Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your minds, so that you may discern what is the will of God—what is good and acceptable and perfect.

For by the grace given to me I say to everyone among you not to think of yourself more highly than you ought to think, but to think with sober judgment, each according to the measure of faith that God has assigned. For as in one body we have many members, and not all the members have the same function, so we, who are many, are one body in Christ, and individually we are members one of another. We have gifts that differ according to the grace given to us: prophecy, in proportion to faith; ministry, in ministering; the teacher, in teaching; the exhorter, in exhortation; the giver, in generosity; the leader, in diligence; the compassionate, in cheerfulness."

Homily

Seminarian Devin Gillespie

(Representatives of the congregation and of the clergy of the diocese stand before the Bishop with the new minister and present various appropriate symbols of the ministry of the whole people of God)

Bishop presents a vessel of water, saying:

Allison, in the water of baptism we are buried with Christ in his death. By it we share in his resurrection. Through it we are reborn by the Holy Spirit. Help me as one who baptizes others into the community and body of Christ.

New Minister: I invite you all to join with me in rejoicing in our Baptismal fel-

lowship, and in nurturing the community of faith.

People Amen. May we all grow into the full stature of Christ.

Representatives present a Bible, saying:

Allison, hold before us the story of God's love and mercy, and above all, the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ. Be among us as a preacher of the Word of God and teacher of the faith.

New Minister: I invite you all to join with me in proclaiming the Gospel of

hope and life.

People: Amen. We have good news to share.

Representatives present a stole, saying:

Allison, hold before us the yoke of Christ and be among us as an example of Christ's gentleness, humility, and compassion.

New Minister: I invite you all to join with me taking Christ's yoke upon

ourselves and learning from Jesus's way, truth, and life.

People: Amen. We will eagerly sit at the feet of Christ our teacher.

Representatives present a vial of oil, saying:

Allison, hold before us the anointing of the Holy Spirit for wholeness of life. Be among us as reconciler and healer.

New Minister: I invite you all to join with me in the ministry of reconciliation

and healing. So that through the power of God we may bring

wholeness of life to all people.

People: Amen. In forgiveness and healing we find new life.

Representatives present a copy of the canons of the diocese, saying:

Allison, we look to you to work with the committees and organizations of the church, and in our community, so that our administration may serve Christ and his Gospel and not just ourselves. Be among us in wisdom and humility in discernment and good humor.

New Minister: I invite you all to join with me in working for the building up

of Christ's Church.

People: Amen. We are the Body of Christ.

Church Wardens present keys to the church, saying:

Allison, we look to you to lead and encourage us to be an open and welcoming community. Accept these keys and let the doors of this place be open to everyone.

New Minister: I invite you all to join with me in welcoming all who would

come into the fellowship of the people of God.

People: Amen. May we greet Christ in all who come.

Representatives present a Hymnal and Book of Common Prayer, saying:

Allison, we look to you to lead us in worship, so that, in word, song, and sacrament, we may be renewed in our life together in our Lord Jesus Christ. Receive these books and be among us as a person of prayer and praise.

New Minister: I invite you all to join with me, and with the whole church, in

regular and constant prayer, thanksgiving, and praise to our

God.

People: Amen. In quietness, confidence, and song will be our

strength.

Representatives present Bread and Wine, saying:

Allison, we look to you as one who presides at the Eucharist and shares with us and with the whole church in the breaking of the bread as a foretaste of the heavenly banquet. Be among us to break the bread and bless the cup.

New Minister: I invite you to join with me in making Eucharist together, in

company with the church in every age.

People: Amen. May we know the Lord Jesus in the breaking of

the bread.

Bishop Allison, let all these be signs of the ministry which is mine and yours,

in this place.

People: Amen.

(New Minister kneels in the midst of the church and says:)

New Minister:

O Lord my God, I am not worthy to have you come under my roof; yet you have called your servant to stand in your house, and to serve at your altar.

To you and to your service I devote myself, body, soul, and spirit. Fill my memory with the record of your mighty works; enlighten my understanding with the light of your Holy Spirit; and may all the desires of my heart and will center in what you would have me do.

Make me and instrument of your salvation for the people entrusted to my care, and grant that I may faithfully administer your holy Sacraments, and by my life and teaching set forth your true and living Word.

Be always with me in carrying out the duties of my ministry. In prayer, quicken my devotion; in praises, heighten my love and gratitude; and grant that by the clearness and brightness of your holy Word, all the world may be drawn into your blessed kingdom. All this I ask for the sake of your Son our Savior Jesus Christ.

All Amen.

Bishop: Greet your new Rector.

(The congregation may respond. Applause is appropriate.)

New Minister: The peace of the Lord be always with you.

People: And also with you.

Glory and honor are yours, Architect of all the universe, your Word has never been silent; you called a people to yourself, as a light to the nations, you delivered them from bondage and led them to a land of promise.

Of your grace, you gave Jesus to be human, to share our life, to proclaim the coming of your holy reign and give himself for us, a fragrant offering.

And so, we present to you ourselves and these gifts of bread and wine, our own humble offerings. Sanctify them by your Holy Spirit to be for your people the Body and Blood of Christ, the holy food and drink of Jesus' last supper with his friends.

On the night before he died for us, our Savior Jesus Christ took bread, and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his friends, and said:

"Take, eat: This is my Body which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

As supper was ending, Jesus took the cup of wine, and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said: "Drink this, all of you: This is my blood of the new Covenant, which is poured out for you and for all for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

Therefore, we proclaim the mystery of faith:

Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again.

We now celebrate, O God, the memorial of Christ our Savior. By means of this holy bread and cup, we show forth the sacrifice of Christ's death, and proclaim the resurrection, until Christ comes in glory.

Gather us by this Holy Communion into one body in the Risen One, and make us a living sacrifice of praise. Through Christ and with Christ and in Christ, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, to you be honor, glory, and praise, for ever and ever. **AMEN**.

And now, as Christ has taught us, we pray: (choose the form you most prefer)

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy Name, thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, for ever and ever. Amen.
