QUESTION – IN WHAT **SEASON ARE WE?**

Why, we are now in the "green season" also known as Ordinary Time which continues until the first Sunday of Advent, Nov 30, 2019. Green is the liturgical color. The following is from

Voice of Trinity Church New York: "During this season, the church delves deeper into scripture and the life of Jesus. We read his parables and remember how he changed the lives of everyone he interacted with, in ways big and small. This is a time when we explore what it means to live daily in faith, a time of growth as we explore everyday sacredness."



**Saint Mary Magdalene

(A disciple of Jesus, she was from the city of Magdala in Judea, hence the surname Magdalene. She was the woman Jesus delivered from evil spirits. Mary was among the women



who accompanied and supported Jesus and the apostles. She was present at the crucifixion. Mary was also the first to witness the resurrection, which Jesus told her to announce to his disciples. Some traditions identify her with Mary of Bethany. Since she witnessed the resurrection, she has been called "equal to the Apostles." Bernard of Clairvaux called her the "apostle to the Apostles." Later tradition identified Mary Magdalene with Mary the Sinner, the penitent prostitute who anointed Jesus' feet. She is commemorated on July 22nd.



*St. James the Apostle

(the Greater). James and John, sons of Zebedee, are mentioned frequently in the gospels. James is usually mentioned first. He is sometimes called "the elder" or "the greater," to distinguish him from the other apostle James, the son of Alphaeus, who is called James the Less. James was a fisherman by trade. James and John left their father and their work as fishermen when called by Jesus. They became apostles, and with Peter formed an inner circle in the apostolic group. They witnessed the Transfiguration, the healing of Peter's mother-in-law, the raising of the daughter of Jairus, and the agony at Gethsemane. Jesus nicknamed the brothers James and John "sons of thunder." Legend claims that James was a great traveler and carried the gospel to Spain. He is the patron saint of that country where he is called Santiago. His work for the Lord in Jerusalem angered Herod, who had him killed about the year 42. He

was the first of the apostles to be martyred and the only one whose martyrdom is mentioned in the Bible (Acts 12:1-2). James's life is commemorated in the Episcopal calendar of the church year on July 25.

Wildflower Planting Soon!

As we enter the monsoon season, we will look for a favorable day when rains are likely to come and will plant our 4+ pounds of wildflower seeds in the back part of our property. We will try to do so in the morning hours before the heat is too hot.

Volunteers to come with rakes and wheelbarrow will be greatly appreciated. Also those who would like to donate a large bag of topsoil/garden soil to get our seeds off to a good start are also appreciated. We will start in the corner next to Martingale Rd and work along the back property line as far as the soil and see will take us.

We will be trying to spread the seeds out so as to prevent over crowding and allow the seeds to spread each year. The planting of our wildflower field is part of our call to stewardship:

- It will hopefully give us a beautiful field of flowers to admire and to allow others in our community to admire.
- It will also provide us with flowers to use in our church for the altar.
- The flowers will also be a source of food for birds/hummingbirds, butterflies, and especially bees. The bee population is in danger from pesticides and this will give them pesticide free food.
- It allows us to use the property in a natural way and one that frees us from needing landscaping services which we do not have the budget for.
- We hope to become a naturalist space where bird watchers and butterfly watchers can come to see various types... or where people can come just to enjoy the flowers.

Tentative date (need to wait for the rains to be forecast) would be July 13th....stay tuned.



Columbarium Expansion

Our church records show that we have now filled (with current or future interments) our columbarium niches. This has prompted our Junior Warden, Sherry Simon, to seek bids on expanding our cabinets in the columbarium to the fullest extent possible.

We have a cabinet maker who will craft new cabinets that will closely match the existing cabinets and provide us with an additional 136 niches. Ten of those will be double sized for two persons' ashes with the remaining 126 being individual niches. The bid for this work is \$6680. We have about \$5400 from previous columbarium niche purchases to put toward the cost of the work.

We would like to ask if you would like to now reserve a spot for your ashes in the soon to be crafted new niches? The current cost is \$300.00 per person. We are evaluating if we are under-priced for the Sierra Vista area and expect the cost could go up a bit after the installation of the new cabinets. Sales of new niches would pay for the remainder of the amount of the new cabinets.

The cabinet maker, Adam, is married to an active duty Army Intel Officer. She is expected to be reassigned to a new post October 1st, so we have a small window of opportunity in which to have Adam complete the work.

Drawings of the proposed new cabinets will be put on the bulletin board in the Parish Hall. Please see Sherry Simon for additional information.
