WHAT IS THE SEASON?? – Why, it is now EPIPHANY

Epiphany lasts until Lent that starts on Wed. Feb. 26th.

The Holy Name Day of our Lord Jesus Christ: January 1

After eight days, tradition tells us that it was time to circumcise the Holy Child. He was named Jesus, given by an angel before he was born.



The Feast of the Epiphany: January 6



The word Epiphany means a manifestation or appearance. Every year on January 6 we celebrate the Feast of the Epiphany. Matthew 2;1 tells us the journey of the Magi, or wise men to Bethlehem. They were perhaps astrologers from the East and saw a certain star. They went to Jerusalem and told King Herod they were looking for the baby born to be king of the Jews. When Herod became angry, he told them to go find the child and let him know so he could also pay him homage. The wise men kept following the star until they found it had stopped over Bethlehem. We don't really know how many there

were or how long the journey took, certainly longer than 12 days after Jesus' birth. But, they joyfully brought the Holy Child gifts and worshiped him. Frankincense, a perfume, symbolizing a deity; Myrrh, an embalming oil, a symbol of death and Gold for the baby's kingship on earth. Because they knew Herod waited for their return, the wise men returned to their home by a different route.

The Baptism of our Lord Jesus Christ: January 12

Although this seems to be right after the Epiphany, the actual timeline is much later. Jesus grew into a man deep into his Jewish faith. His cousin, John the Baptist, was at the Jordan river baptizing people in the water for repentance. Jesus appeared and asked to also be baptized. John at first refused but Jesus reminded him they needed to fulfill all righteousness. As Jesus came up from the water, the heavens opened to Him and the Spirit

of God descended like a dove on him. God said: "This is my Son, the Beloved with whom I am well pleased". From that time forward, we are also baptized in the name of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit by water and the Holy Spirit. We renew our baptismal vows on this day every year, at Easter, and every baptism during the year.



The Presentation of Our Lord Jesus Christ in the Temple – Feb. 2

February 2: Jesus Presented in the Temple Forty Days after birth, Mary went to the Temple for their purification ceremony according to the law of Moses. Every first-born male was to be designated as holy to the Lord. Here she was met by Simeon who took the child in his arms and praised God. Since he was a highly devout man to whom the Holy Spirit had revealed that he would not die until he had seen the Lord's Messiah. Simeon praised with the words "Master, now you



are dismissing your servant in peace according to your word, for my eyes have seen your salvation, which you have prepared in the presence of all peoples, a light for revelation to the Gentiles and for glory to your people Israel." He blessed Mary and Joseph told them that their child would be destined for the falling and rising of many in Israel, and to be a sign that will be opposed and the inner thoughts of many will be revealed ---oh, by the way, a sword will pierce your own soul too. Mary and Joseph were amazed at what he had said about Jesus. It was soon after that the family went back to Nazareth where Jesus grew up, filled with the favor and wisdom of God.

Between the annual meeting and the vestry retreat, I will be going to Prescott for the annual clergy retreat on Jan 28-30.


In all of our busy-ness, I ask your prayers for our church and its ministry to worship, grow, and care for each other in our family of faith.

PARISH EVENTS



THE PARISH MEETING IS SUNDAY JANUARY 26TH AFTER THE 10:30 SERVICE followed by a potluck lunch.

A highlight of this meeting will be the State of the Church Address by Rev. Allison who is foregoing the usual sermon for the day. Also of importance is filling three open positions on the Vestry plus delegates to the Diocesan Convention. The Vestry positions are Clerk, Treasurer and Vestry Member. The following are very brief descriptions of the offices:

Vestry Member (more detailed description is posted in the Parish Hall)

- **Time Commitments** include Vestry and committee meetings; Vestry retreat(s); Weekly worship services.
 - rotating occasionally if more than one is offered; congregational events such as coffee hours, meals, fundraisers, Christian formation programs, etc; Diocesan meetings as necessary and the Annual meeting.
- Responsibilities include bringing one's whole self to the table; being present in mind, body, and spirit; risking openness with one's ideas, beliefs, and desires; praying daily for the rector, leaders, and members of the congregation.

Treasurer (more detailed description is posted in the Parish Hall)


- Time Commitments include weekly oversight of collections and deposits; periodic payment of bills and monthly generation of accounting reports.
- Responsibilities (some but not all) include supervise the collection, counting, and deposit of all
 contributions; supervise the treasurers of all other accounts, ensure that bills are paid in a timely fashion; work
 with any designated committee to make certain that adequate insurance is maintained on all real property;
 determine that the books and accounts of the congregation are kept in accordance with standard accounting
 procedures and the requirements of the canons; ensure that the congregation's financial operations are in
 accordance with The Episcopal Church's and diocesan canons, congregational bylaws, and state and federal
 laws; meet regularly with the rector, wardens, and/or staff for planning and evaluation; develop (if one does not
 exist) and serve on the finance committee; assist in the
 development of budgets; submit onthly financial report to the vestry and an annual financial report to the
 congregation and make appropriate contributions to the diocesan parochial report

Clerk (more detailed description is posted in the Parish Hall)

• **Time commitment** include distribution of agenda and minutes from previous meetings; maintain roster of members and contact information and other duties as deemed necessary by the rector and senior warden.

Responsibilities include take notes during vestry meetings and afterwards, prepare and distribute minutes; maintain a file of all vestry meeting minutes; if asked, take minutes for the annual congregation meeting and prepare, date, sign, and maintain documents as required

NOTE: Vestry members (all) will attend a vestry retreat in Tucson at the Redemptorist Retreat Center Jan 31st and Feb 1st (overnight). Cost for the overnight and 3 meals is \$135.00


