SHROVE TUESDAY

Shrove Tuesday is the day before Ash Wednesday, many congregations offer a pancake supper which comes from the tradition from the medieval custom of using up all the cream, eggs and fat in the household before the Lenten fast. The word "shrove" comes from the verb "to shrive" meaning to confess and receive absolution, referring to the practice of going to confession at the beginning of Lent. Submitted by Dottie Gutwein

ASH WEDNESDAY

Ash Wednesday is **February 26, 2020** - on Wednesday six weeks before Easter, Lent begins with Ash Wednesday. Christians worldwide honor the day by attending services at their respective churches. Lent is a time of



reflection on the transgressions we may have done the past year, a time of denying oneself of particular enjoyments or some prefer to take on a task or discipline out of their ordinary way. It is a time of prayer and some discernment of one's own spiritual life. In preparation for Ash Wednesday, the Blessed Palms left from the previous year are burned and the ashes stored in a container until the time of the Ash Wednesday service. The focus on the day is on penitence, or sorrow for sin, and fasting; the imposition of ashes is a reminder that we are mortal and that we receive eternal life as a free gift of God. After ashes are placed in sign of a cross on the congregation's foreheads, they read together Psalm 51 then pray the Litany of Penitence—a corporate public confession of our failure to love and serve and forgive others. The priest then pronounces the absolution we have been given by God. Submitted by Dottie Gutwein

GREETINGS FROM REV. ALLISON



Dear Friends,

We have just concluded our annual meeting weekend and we see that we have had a terrific first year together. We accomplished several of our goals concerning our mortgage debt and desire for air conditioning. We have done a number of other facilities updates or upgrades also. We are exercising good stewardship by caring for the facilities that we have received from church members that have come before us. Our church buildings are a part of our evangelism as we ensure those who come to worship, pray, learn, and fellowship with us feel comfortable and welcome in our faith home.

We have also been generous in our support of those who are less well off in our community through our giving of food, school supplies, kids and youth toys,

clothes, and snacks, financial assistance for rent, hotel, utilities, and travel; support for the animal shelter with food, pet supplies, and monetary donations, and on and on...

And as we start a new year, we hope to help others with similar needs. However, we noted that our budget is in immediate need of support to allow us to continue to be the hands and feet of Christ in our community. I will be reducing my time to ¾ time which reduces my salary by about \$15,000.00. The other \$15,000.00 needed to make a balanced budget needs to come from the church, from your generosity that I noted above is so evident in what we have been able to do together for others. If 15 people give an additional \$1000 each for the coming year (which works out to about \$20 each week), we will come very close to a balanced budget.

To help us in the years to come, we would also like to increase our membership. The single most effective way to add new members has been shown repeatedly to be the personal invite. Survey after survey shows that 75% or more of people queried have said that if someone, they knew asked them to come to church they would. I encourage us all to be the ambassadors for Christ that we are called to be.... To invite people to "Come and See." Come and find a family of faithful who pray, care for, worship, sing, grow, give and have fun together as the body of Christ in our corner of the world.

God is active and answering prayers in our midst. See our blessings all around us and invite others to be part of what we have found in our faith.
