From our Rector:

Hello St. Stephen's,

The autumn is here with cooler temperatures and less rains than during the summer monsoons are among us. We were blessed with a very good monsoon this year in our area. Give thanks to God for the replenishment of our streams and aguifers.

The Holy Spirit has been flowing this summer and into the fall also. As Jesus once described: "The wind blows wherever it pleases. You hear its sound, but you cannot tell where it comes from or where it is going. So it is with everyone born of the Spirit." This past spring and summer we welcomed several new people who have begun attending our worship services. We give thanks for those new people who bring new ideas and talents and spirit to our beloved community.

Another manifestation of the Holy Spirit is in bringing our church, St. Stephens, and Sierra Lutheran (ELCA) together in two ways. The first is that we will begin in November to minister jointly with St. Raphael's in Benson. Rev. Debbie Royals, St. Raphael's Vicar, is about to start a new ministry. In discussion with the bishops of the Diocese of Arizona (TEC), Grand Canyon Synod (ELCA), and also with the Bishop's Committee of St. Raphael's a plan to share the worship and other ministry areas between our churches was developed. Many of the details are still being worked out, and we expect to begin this shared ministry in November. In order for me to lead worship on Sunday on alternating Sundays in Benson, St. Stephen's will be moving the Sunday morning worship time to 11am. I will share additional details after some upcoming meetings with Rev. Royals and the Bishop Committee of St. Raphael's.

The other way that the Holy Spirit is moving in our midst is that St. Stephen's and Sierra Lutheran are planning to hold a combined Youth Group starting in November also. The theme for this first ministry together will be "Jesus was a Jedi and you can be one too!" We will show the Star Wars movie "A New Hope" (episode 4, the first movie made) and look at the spirituality that is expressed in the movie and compare it to the teachings of Jesus. The Youth Group will meet at Sierra Lutheran on Tuesday nights at 6pm til 8pm with dinner from 6pm to 6:30pm and then the discussion following using the book "Star Wars Jesus" by Caleb Grimes.

I give thanks to these new avenues in ministry that allow our church to support others in their spiritual journeys. May God's Spirit continue to blow through all our lives in surprising and uplifting ways.
