FEAST OF NINO OF GEORGIA

Saint Nino (Georgian: β∂οδως δοδω, romanized: ts'minda nino; Armenian: Unipp Gniūt, romanized: Surb Nune; Greek: Αγία Nίνα, romanized: Agía Nína; sometimes St. Nune or St. Ninny) Equal to the Apostles and the Enlightener of Georgia (c. 296 – c. 338 or 340) was a woman who preached Christianity in the territory of Caucasian Iberia, of what is now part of Georgia. It resulted in the Christianization of the royal house of Iberia, with the consequent Christianization of Iberia.

According to most widely traditional accounts, she belonged to a Greek-speaking Roman family from Kolastra, Cappadocia, was a relative of Saint George, and came to Georgia (ancient Iberia) from Constantinople. Other sources claim she was from Rome, Jerusalem or Gaul (modern France). According to legend, she performed miraculous healings and converted the Georgian queen, Nana, and eventually the pagan king Mirian III of Iberia, who, lost in darkness and blinded on a hunting trip, found his way only after he prayed to "Nino's God". Mirian declared Christianity the official religion

The Word of God (*Please be seated*)

The Old Testament: A reading from 2 Kings 5:1-14

Naaman, commander of the army of the king of Aram, was a great man and in high favor with his master, because by him the Lord had given victory to Aram. The man, though a mighty warrior, suffered from leprosy. Now the Arameans on one of their raids had taken a young girl captive from the land of Israel, and she served Naaman's wife. She said to her mistress, "If only my lord were with the prophet who is in Samaria! He would cure him of his leprosy." So Naaman went in and told his lord just what the girl from the land of Israel had said. And the king of Aram said, "Go then, and I will send along a letter to the king of Israel."

He went, taking with him ten talents of silver, six thousand shekels of gold, and ten sets of garments. He brought the letter to the king of Israel, which read, "When this letter reaches you, know that I have sent to you my servant Naaman, that you may cure him of his leprosy." When the king of Israel read the letter, he tore his clothes and said, "Am I God, to give death or life, that this man sends word to me to cure a man of his leprosy? Just look and see how he is trying to pick a quarrel with me."

But when Elisha the man of God heard that the king of Israel had torn his clothes, he sent a message to the king, "Why have you torn your clothes? Let him come to me, that he may learn that there is a prophet in Israel." So Naaman came with his horses and chariots, and halted at the entrance of Elisha's house. Elisha sent a messenger to him, saying, "Go, wash in the Jordan seven times, and your flesh shall be restored and you shall be clean." But Naaman became angry and went away, saying, "I thought that for me he would surely come out, and stand and call on the name of the Lord his God, and would wave his hand over the spot, and cure the leprosy! Are not Abana and Pharpar, the rivers of Damascus, better than all the waters of Israel? Could I not wash in them, and be clean?" He turned and went away in a rage. But his servants approached and said to him, "Father, if the prophet had commanded you to do something difficult, would you not have done it? How much more, when all he said to you was, 'Wash, and be clean'?" So he went down and immersed himself seven times in the Jordan, according to the word of the man of God; his flesh was restored like the flesh of a young boy, and he was clean.

Homily

(c. 327) and Nino continued her missionary activities among Georgians until her death.

Her tomb is still shown at the <u>Bodbe Monastery</u> in <u>Kakheti</u>, eastern Georgia. St. Nino has become one of the most venerated saints of the <u>Georgian Orthodox Church</u> and her attribute, a grapevine cross, is a symbol of Georgian Christianity.

Early life

Many sources agree that Nino was born in the small town of <u>Colastri</u>, in the <u>Roman province</u> of Cappadocia, although a smaller number of sources disagree with this. On her family and origin, the Roman Catholic Church and the Eastern Orthodox Church have different traditions.

According to the Eastern Orthodox Church tradition, she was the only child of a famous family. Her father was <u>Roman</u> general <u>Zabulon</u> and her mother <u>Sosana</u> (Susan). On her father's side, Nino was related to <u>St. George</u>, and on her mother's, to the patriarch of Jerusalem, <u>Houbnal I</u>.

During her childhood, Nino was brought up by the <u>nun Niofora-Sarah</u> of <u>Bethlehem</u>. Nino's uncle, who was the <u>patriarch of Jerusalem</u>, oversaw her traditional upbringing. Nino went to <u>Rome</u> with the help of her uncle where she decided to preach the Christian gospel in Iberia, known to her as the resting place of Christ's tunic. According to the legend, Nino received a vision where the <u>Virgin Mary</u> gave her a grapevine cross and said:

"Go to Iberia and tell there the Good Tidings of the Gospel of Jesus Christ, and you will find favour before the Lord; and I will be for you a shield against all visible and invisible enemies. By the strength of this cross, you will erect in that land the saving banner of faith in My beloved Son and Lord."

Saint Nino entered the Iberian Kingdom in Caucasus from the <u>Kingdom of Armenia</u>, where she escaped persecution at the hands of the Armenian King <u>Tiridates III</u>. She had belonged to a community of virgins numbering 35, along with martyr <u>Hripsime</u>, under the leadership of St. Gayane, who preached Christianity in the Armenian Kingdom. They were all, with the exception of Nino, tortured and beheaded by Tiridates. All 35 of the virgins were soon canonised by the <u>Armenian Apostolic Church</u>, including Nino (as St. Nune).

Contrasting with this, the Roman Catholic tradition, as narrated by <u>Rufinus of Aquileia</u>, says Nino was brought to Iberia not by her own will, but as a slave, and that her family tree is obscure. [4]


St Nino in Iberia

Nino reached the borders of the ancient Georgian <u>Kingdom of Iberia</u> from the south about 320. There she placed a Christian cross in the small town of <u>Akhalkalaki</u> and started preaching the Christian faith in <u>Urbnisi</u>, finally reaching <u>Mtskheta</u> (the capital of Iberia). The Iberian Kingdom had been influenced by the neighbouring <u>Persian Empire</u> which played an important role as the regional power in the Caucasus. The Iberian King Mirian III and his nation worshiped the syncretic gods <u>Armazi</u> and <u>Zaden</u>. Soon after the arrival of

Nino in Mtskheta, Nana, the Queen of Iberia requested an audience with Continued online
