Welcome and Announcements:

Josephine Margaret Bakhita, F.D.C.C. (ca. 1869 – 8 February 1947), was a <u>Sudanese-Italian Canossian religious sister</u> who lived in <u>Italy</u> for 45 years, after having been a <u>slave</u> in <u>Sudan</u>. In 2000, she was declared a <u>saint</u>, the first Black woman to receive the honor in the modern era.

<u>Early life</u>

She was born around 1869 in <u>Darfur</u> (now in western Sudan) in the village of <u>Olgossa</u>, west of <u>Nyala</u> and close to <u>Mount Agilerei</u>.^[1] She was of the <u>Daju people</u>;^{[2][3]} her respected and reasonably prosperous father was brother of the village chief. She was surrounded by a loving family of three brothers and three sisters; as she says in her autobiography: "I lived a very happy and carefree life, without knowing what suffering was".^[4]

<u>Slavery</u>

In 1877, when she was 7–8 years old, she was seized by <u>Arab slave traders</u>, who had abducted her elder sister two years earlier. She was forced to walk barefoot about 960 kilometres (600 mi) to <u>El-Obeid</u> and was sold and bought

Homily

As supper was ending, Jesus took the cup of wine, and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said: "Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is poured out for you and for all for the forgiveness of sins. twice before she arrived there. Over the course of twelve years (1877–1889) she was sold three more times and then she was finally given her freedom

'Bakhita' was not the name she received from her parents at birth. It is said that the trauma of her abduction caused her to forget her original name; she took one given to her by the slavers, $bakh\bar{t}a$ (,[5][6][7] She was also forcibly converted to Islam.

In El-Obeid, Bakhita was bought by a rich Arab who used her as a maid for his two daughters. They treated her relatively well, until after offending one of her owner's sons, wherein the son lashed and kicked her so severely that she spent more than a month unable to move from her straw bed. Her fourth owner was a Turkish general, and she had to serve his mother-in-law and his wife, who were cruel to their slaves. Bakhita says: "During all the years I stayed in that house, I do not recall a day that passed without some wound or other. When a wound from the whip began to heal, other blows would pour down on me."^[9]

She says that the most terrifying of all of her memories there was when she (along with other slaves) was marked by a process resembling both <u>scarification</u> and <u>tattooing</u>, which was a traditional practice throughout Sudan.^{[10][11]} As her mistress was watching her with a whip in her hand, a dish of white flour, a dish of salt and a razor were brought by a woman. She used the flour to draw patterns on her skin and then she cut deeply along the lines before filling the wounds with salt to ensure permanent scarring. A total of 114 intricate patterns were cut into her breasts, belly and into her right arm.^{[12][13]}

By the end of 1882, El-Obeid came under the threat of an attack of <u>Mahdist</u> revolutionaries.^[14] The Turkish general began making preparations to return to his homeland and sold his slaves. In 1883, Bakhita was bought in <u>Khartoum</u> by the Italian <u>Vice Consul</u> Callisto Legnani, who treated her kindly and did not beat or punish her.^[15] Two years later, when Legnani himself had to return to Italy, Bakhita begged to go with him. At the end of 1884 they escaped from a besieged Khartoum with a friend, Augusto Michieli. They travelled a risky 650-kilometre (400 mi) trip on camelback to <u>Suakin</u>, which was the largest port of Sudan. In March 1885 they left Suakin for Italy and arrived at the port of <u>Genoa</u> in April. They were met there by Augusto Michieli's wife, Maria Turina Michieli, to whom Legnani gave ownership of Bakhita. Her new owners took her to their family villa at Zianigo, near <u>Mirano</u>, Veneto, about 25 km (16 mi) west of <u>Venice</u>.^[10] She lived there for three years and became nanny to the Michieli's daughter Alice, known as 'Mimmina', born in February 1886. The Michielis brought Bakhita with them back to the Sudan where they stayed for nine months before returning to Italy.

Conversion to Catholicism and freedom

<u>Suakin</u> on the <u>Red Sea</u> was besieged but remained in <u>Anglo-Egyptian</u> hands. Augusto Michieli acquired a large hotel there and decided to sell his property in Italy and to move his family to Sudan permanently. Selling his house and lands took longer than expected. By the end of 1888, Turina Michieli wanted to see her husband in Sudan even though land transactions were unfinished. Since the villa in Zianigo was already sold, Bakhita and Mimmina needed a temporary place to stay while Micheli went to Sudan without them. On the advice of their business agent Illuminato Cecchini, on 29 November 1888, Michieli left
