Opening Call to Worship:

Leader: God is calling us out of the places we hide, out of insecurity,

Out of shame, out from under that which silences love and justice.

Come out, people of God!

People: Though we may be afraid, though we will be at risk

Though our honesty may be viewed as a threat

God calls us to courage!

Leader: Our God is a god of resurrection. Of new life and new creation.

Of hope in the face of evil.

And so we dare to proclaim, with pride and faith, our truths:

People: We believe in the power of love.

We believe in solidarity with the suffering.

We believe we are each valuable.

We believe that our togetherness is transformative.

Leader: The world is longing for Holy Truths that reveal, voices that speak

real words of hope. Come out, people of God!

Sharing the Peace:

Presider May the goodness, strength, and peace of God be with you all.

Opening Prayer:

Leader: Let us pray as we acknowledge this 2022 National Coming Out Day.

ALL: Loving God, in your wisdom, you created a world rich with diversity. We give thanks for the gifts of sexual orientation and gender identity. We celebrate with our queer, transgender, bisexual, lesbian, and gay siblings who choose to come out, and honor those who do not.

Today, we say "yes" to the diversity among us—within ourselves, our families, our neighbors, and our communities. We claim that diversity as we come before you and as we go out into the world.

At times, we turn away from this diversity, fearful of its transformative power. We reject that which is different, force it to be silent, or pretend that it does not exist. We participate in systems that privilege sameness and uproot difference.

Give us the courage to live boldly into the mystery of diversity, the strength to persevere in the face of adversity, and the power to love in ways that go beyond understanding. Help us create a world where all queer, transgender, bisexual, lesbian, and gay people can flourish. Amen.

People: That we may create a society rooted in love, grounded in justice, and strengthened by difference.

ALL: God, hear our prayers and deepen our willingness to show up with and for one another, sharing in each other's burdens and working for one another's protection and care. Amen.

Presider Continues

Indeed, we give you thanks, our Divine Creator. You declared from the beginning that we were created in your imagine, a reflection of what is good and holy, each, in our own way, a glimpse of you. We praise the works of your creative hand that fills our life with beauty. Every flower that blooms, every animal that delights, every body of water that sustains our life – all part of your good works.

Despite the abundance of life around us, often we still turn to destruction. Each in our own ways, we have failed to embrace you by failing to embrace all your people, especially those different than us. We have, at times, sided with political and religious powers that refuse to recognize your image in all people.

And so we praise you joining our voices with angels, archangels and with all the company of heaven who forever sing to proclaim the glory of your name:

Holy, Holy, Holy Lord, God of power and might.

Heaven and earth are full of your glory.

Hosanna in the highest.

Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord.

And we turn to Jesus, who showed us what it looks like to live into our true selves as people of God. He was humble yet grounded in your love for him. He

sought out the despised and made them friends. He confronted every power that belittled, marginalized, and oppressed. His commitment to living out the image of God in human form could not be swayed, even in the face of death.

On the night of his arrest, he gathered around the table with his companions. He took bread, blessed it, broke it, gave it to his followers and said, "This is my body which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of me."

He did the same with the cup of wine after the supper, saying, "This cup that is poured out is the new covenant in my blood. Whenever you drink of it, do this in remembrance of me."

Even in death, O God, your love prevailed. Through you Spirit, Christ was raised from the grave. No person, no institution, no force of evil could extinguish the work of your hand.

And so, by the same Spirit, bless these gifts of bread and cup (+) that they may be the living Christ within us today (+); compelling us to be agents of love, uncompromising in our commitment to protect every one of your creatures and creations.

The Breaking of the Bread:

(Presider breaks the consecrated bread)

Presider: Just as the grain that was used to make this bread was once scattered

over the land and then gathered together to make this one bread, God, gather your people together from all over the world into your

one holy and eternal community.

People: Happy are we who share this holy meal of bread and wine.

Invitation to Communion:

Presider: This is not my table, this is not St. Stephen's church's table.

This is Christ's Table. Jesus invites you to come forward and

receive the bread and the wine in this place.

Please come forward to the rail and stand or kneel. Put out your hand to receive the bread,

hold onto the bread if you also would like wine from the chalice. Please dip/intinct the bread into the wine and then consume it. If you do not wish to have the wine, you may eat your bread when you receive it. You may instead of receiving the bread and wine, receive a blessing by crossing your arms over your chest. After receiving communion or blessing, return to your seat.

Embrace your own difference, celebrate the difference of others, and proclaim the Good News: God's love does not conform to the binary expectation of our culture. It is without boundary. It extends to all. And the blessing of God: Creator, Sustainer, and Reconciler be with you now and always. **Amen.**
