### From our Rector:

A Holy Lent to you all,

As I write this note, we have just begun our Lenten season with Ash Wednesday this last week of February. As I mentioned in my homily on Wednesday, "An unexamined life is not worth living." This is a quote attributed to Socrates, a Greek philosopher. We don't often set time aside to deliberately examine our lives. The season of Lent is an opportunity to do just that. The church following the Jewish model has made this season part of the church calendar to allow us to intentionally set some time aside to reflect on how we are living our lives, how have we grown and matured in wisdom or faith or in any of the fruits of the spirit (Love, Joy, Peace, Patience, Kindness, Goodness, Faithfulness, Gentleness and Self-control)? Are there places where we have lingering regrets or resentments (grudges) that we need to work through?

People who participate in 12-step groups do this same self-examination in steps 4-7:

- 4. Made a searching and fearless moral inventory of ourselves.
- 5. Admitted to God, to ourselves and to another human being the exact nature of our wrongs.
- 6. Were entirely ready to have God remove all these defects of character.
- 7. Humbly asked Him to remove our shortcomings.

These steps (and the rest of the 12) were established over a few years and with the help of an Episcopal Priest, Rev. Sam Shoemaker. Bill Wilson one of the founders of AA wrote of Rev. Shoemaker: "The early A.A. got its ideas of self-examination, acknowledgment of character defects, restitution for harm done, and working with others straight from the Oxford Groups and directly from Sam Shoemaker, their former leader in America, and from nowhere else."

In the Episcopal Church, we have informal and formal ways of helping anyone who is stuck in getting through such a self-examination and acknowledgement of character defects. It is called confession in the Roman Catholic Church and the Rite of Reconciliation in the Episcopal Church. Each time we worship and say the General Confession we have an opportunity to surrender to God our wrongs and defects. That is the informal way. If that seems to work, that is great. If you still feel stuck and need to talk it out with a trusted person, you can ask to meet with me, your priest, and everything will be held in strict confidence.

Across the church and across time, we have come to see that self-examination is an important part of our growth in spirituality and faith. Admitting our errors, mistakes, wrongs and working to improve ourselves to meet future challenges and temptations is healthy and healing and enables us to grow in the love of God. May we each take time this Lent to examine our lives, making them ever more worth living.
