there's not any one to be found, no, not one



Many people enjoyed Maryhelen's Tuna Salad after the service on Sunday June 25 th and asked for the recipe. She has kindly obliged and has submitted this: 2 to 3 cans of tuna in water.
Problems just tumbled about me, And heavier came each task, Why doesn't God help me? I wondered. He answered, "You didn't ask."	Place in a fine mesh strainer. Using a paper plate, hand press out the water. Place in a bowl and set aside.
I wanted to see joy and beauty, But the day toiled on grey and bleak, I wondered why didn't God show me, He said, "You didn't seek." I tried to come into God's presence, I tried all my keys at the lock, God gently and lovingly chided, "My child, you didn't knock."	As much as you like, diced celery, finely diced white onion and chopped fresh parsley, folded into the tuna. In a separate bowl, whisk together, Mayonnaise, Lawry's brand season salt, Garlic powder, a few dashes of Tabasco brand sauce, and 1 packet of True Lemon brand crystallized lemon (or lemon juice).
