FEAST OF SAINT MARY THE VIRGIN

<u>Mary^[c]</u> was a first-century <u>Judean</u> woman of <u>Nazareth</u>,^[6] the wife of <u>Joseph</u> and the mother of <u>Jesus</u>. She is a central figure of <u>Christianity</u>, venerated under <u>various titles</u> such as virgin or queen, many of them mentioned in the <u>Litany of Loreto</u>. The <u>Eastern</u> and <u>Oriental Orthodox</u>, <u>Church of the East</u>, <u>Catholic</u>, <u>Anglican</u>, and <u>Lutheran</u> churches believe that Mary, as mother of Jesus, is the <u>Mother of God</u>. Other <u>Protestant views on Mary</u> vary, with some holding her to have considerably lesser status.

The <u>New Testament</u> describes Mary as a young virgin^[d] who was chosen by <u>God</u> to <u>conceive Jesus</u> through the <u>Holy Spir-</u><u>it</u>. After <u>giving birth to Jesus</u> in <u>Bethlehem</u>, she raised him in the city of <u>Naza-</u><u>reth</u> in <u>Galilee</u>, and was in <u>Jerusalem</u> at his <u>crucifixion</u> and with the <u>apostles</u> after his <u>ascension</u>. CONTEMPORARY NICENE CREED: (please stand as you are able)

Therefore, joining with Angels and Archangels and with the faithful of every generation, we lift our voices with all creation as we say/sing: **Sanctus**


Then, in the fullness of time, you sent your eternal Word, made mortal flesh in Jesus. Born into the human family, and dwelling among us, he revealed your glory. Giving himself freely to death on the cross, he triumphed over evil, opening the way of freedom and life.

On the night before he died for us, Our Savior Jesus Christ took bread, and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his friends, and said: *"Take, eat: This is my Body which is given for you. Do this for the* remembrance of me."

As supper was ending, Jesus took the cup of wine, and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said: "Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is poured out for you and for all for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

Therefore we proclaim the mystery of faith: Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again.

Remembering his death and resurrection, we now present to you from



your creation this bread and this wine. By your Holy Spirit (+) may they be for us the Body and Blood of our Savior Jesus Christ.

Grant that we who share these gifts may be filled with the Holy Spirit (+) and live as Christ's Body in the world. Bring us into the everlasting heritage of your daughters and sons, that with all your saints, past, present, and yet to come, we may praise your Name for ever.

is not accounted in the Bible, <u>Catholic</u> and <u>Eastern Christian</u> traditions believe that her body <u>was raised</u> into <u>heaven</u> at the end of her earthly life, which is known in <u>Western Christianity</u> as the <u>Assumption of Mary</u> and in <u>Eastern Christianity</u> as the <u>Dormition of the Mother of God</u>. <u>Mary has been venerated</u> since <u>early Christianity</u>,^{[10][11]} and is considered by millions to be the holiest and greatest <u>saint</u>. There is a certain diversity in the <u>Mariology</u> and devotional practices of major Christian traditions. The Catholic Church holds <u>distinctive Marian dogmas</u>, namely her <u>Immaculate Conception</u> and her Assumption into heaven.^[12] Many <u>Protestants</u> minimize Mary's role, based on what they argue is lack of biblical support for any beliefs other than her status as the <u>Mother of God</u> and the <u>virgin birth</u>.^[13] She is mentioned several times in the <u>Quran</u>, including in a chapter <u>named after her</u>, and has the <u>highest position in Islam</u> among all women.^{[14][15][16]}

The multiple forms of <u>Marian devotions</u> include various <u>prayers</u> and <u>hymns</u>, the celebration of several <u>Marian feast days</u> in <u>liturgy</u>, the veneration of <u>images</u> and <u>relics</u>, the construction of <u>churches dedicated to Mary</u> and <u>pilgrimages</u> to <u>Marian shrines</u>. Many <u>Marian apparitions</u> and <u>miracles</u> attributed to her <u>intercession</u> have been reported by believers over the centuries. She has been a traditional <u>subject in arts</u>, notably in <u>Byzantine art</u>, <u>medieval art</u> and <u>Renaissance art</u>.

Names and titles

Mary's name in the original manuscripts of the New Testament was based on her original <u>Aramaic</u> name <u>maic</u> name <u>mary</u> comes from the Greek Μαρία, a shortened form of the name Μαριάμ. Both Μαρία and Μαριάμ appear in the New Testament.

In Christianity

In Christianity, Mary is commonly referred to as the Virgin Mary, in accordance with the belief that the <u>Holy Spirit</u> impregnated her, thereby conceiving her first-born son Jesus <u>miraculously</u>, without <u>sexual relations</u> with her betrothed/husband Joseph, "until her son [Jesus] was born".^[18] The word "until" has inspired considerable analysis on whether Joseph and Mary produced <u>siblings</u> after the birth of Jesus or not.^[e] Among her many other names and titles are the <u>Blessed</u> <u>Virgin Mary</u> (often abbreviated to "BVM", or "BMV" after the <u>Latin</u> "*Beata Maria Virgo*"),^[20] Saint Mary (occasionally), the <u>Mother of God</u> (primarily in <u>Western Christianity</u>), the <u>Theoto-kos</u> (primarily in <u>Eastern Christianity</u>), Our Lady (Medieval <u>Italian</u>: *Madonna*), and <u>Queen of Heaven</u> (*Regina caeli*; see also <u>here</u>).^{[21][22]} The title "queen of heaven" had previously been used as an <u>epithet</u> for a number of ancient sky-goddesses, such as <u>Min-anna</u>, Astarte, Ishtar and Astoreth, the <u>Canaanite</u> sky-goddess worshipped during the Hebrew prophet Jeremiah's life-time.^[23]

Titles in use vary among <u>Anglicans</u>, <u>Lutherans</u>, <u>Catholics</u>, <u>Orthodox</u>, <u>Protestants</u>, <u>Mormons</u>, and <u>other Christians</u>.

The three main titles for Mary used by the Orthodox are *Theotokos* (Θ εοτόκος or "Godbearer"), <u>Aeiparthenos</u> (ἀειπαρθένος) which means ever-virgin, as confirmed in the <u>Second</u> <u>Council of Constantinople</u> in 553, and <u>Panagia</u> (Παναγία) meaning Cont. online

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
