
Welcome to St. Stephen's Episcopal Church

The Lessons from Scripture (please be seated for the lessons)

First Reading: from the book of Isaiah (26:16-19):

HOLY ONE, in distress they sought you, they pressed out a whispered prayer when your chastening was on them. Just as an expectant mother writhes-in-labor and cries out in her pangs when her birthing time is near; thus were we because of you, Holy One.

We too were expectant, we writhed-in-labor, but it was as though we birthed only wind. No victories have we won on earth, neither do the inhabitants of the world fall.

Your dead shall live; their corpses shall rise. Awake and sing for joy you who dwell in the dust! For your dew is a radiant dew, and the earth shall release those long dead.

Reader: The word of the Lord. **People: Thanks be to God.**

The Psalm

Psalm 68: 4-11

4 Sing to God, sing praises to her Name; exalt her who rides upon the clouds;

HOLY is her Name, rejoice before her!

- 5 Mother of orphans and defender of widows, is God in her holy habitation!
- 6 God settles the solitary in a home bringing prisoners into prosperity;

while the rebellious shall live in a wasteland.

Second Reading: from the first Epistle to the Thessalonians (4: 13-18):

Now we do not want you to be ignorant, sisters and brothers, about those who have fallen asleep, so that you might not grieve as those do who have no hope. For since we believe that Jesus died and rose, they who sleep, God will, by Jesus, bring with him. For this we declare to you by the word of the -Most High God, that we who are alive, who remain until the coming of Jesus, will not precede those who have fallen asleep. For Jesus himself, with a command, in the voice of the archangel and with the trumpet of God, will descend from heaven, and the dead in Christ will rise first. Then we who are alive who are left, together with them, will be caught up in the clouds to meet Jesus in the air; and so we will be with Jesus forever. Therefore comfort one another with these words.

Reader: The word of the Lord. **People: Thanks be to God.**

Gospel Reading Luke (2:1-20)

Deacon: The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke.

People: Glory to you, Lord Christ

Now it happened in those days that a decree went out from Caesar Augustus that all the world should be registered (for taxation). This was the first registration and occurred while Quirinius was governor of Syria. So all went to be registered; each to their own towns. Joseph also went up from Galilee, out of the city of Nazareth in to Judea, to the city of David called Bethlehem, for he was from the house and heritage of David. He went to be registered with Mary, to whom he was betrothed and who was pregnant. So it was, that, while they were there, the time came for her to birth her child. And she gave birth to her firstborn son and swaddled him, and laid him in a manger, because there was no place for them in the inn.

Shepherds were in that region there staying in the fields, keeping watch over their flock by night. Then an angel of the Most High God came upon them, and the glory of the Living God shone around them, and they were greatly terrified. But the angel said to them, "Fear not. Look! For I proclaim to you good news of great joy for all the people: For there is born to you this day a Savior who is the Messiah, the Sovereign God, in the city of David. This will be a sign for you: you will find a baby swaddled and lying in a manger." And immediately there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly array,

praising God and saying,

"Glory to God in the highest heaven, and on earth peace among peoples whom God favors!"

And it happened when the angels had departed from them into heaven, the shepherds said to one another, "Let us go now to Bethlehem and see this thing that has come to be, which the Sovereign God has made known to us." So they came hurrying and found Mary and Joseph, and the baby lying in the manger.

Now seeing this, they made known what had been spoken to them about this child. And all who heard marveled at what was spoken by the shepherds to them. But Mary preserved all these words and pondered them in her heart. The shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all they had heard and seen; it was just as it had been told them.

Sermon

The Nicene Creed All say together

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father. Through him all things were made.

For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven: by the power of the Holy Spirit he became incarnate from the Virgin Mary, and was made man.

For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son. With the Father and the Son he is worshiped and glorified. He has spoken through the Prophets.

We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church.

We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.

Prayers of the People

- Leader: We wait in the darkness, expectantly, longingly, anxiously, thoughtfully.
- People: The darkness is our friend. In the darkness of the womb, we have all been nurtured and protected. In the darkness of the womb, the Christ-child was made ready for the journey into the light.
- Leader: It is only in darkness that we can see the splendor of the universe—the blanket of stars, the solitary glowing of distant planets and suns.
- People: It was the darkness that allowed the magi to find the star that guided them to where the Christ-child lay.
- Leader: In the darkness of the night, desert people find relief from the cruel and relentless heat of the sun.
- People: In the blessed darkness, Mary and Joseph were able to flee with the infant Jesus to safety in Egypt.
- Leader: In the darkness of sleep, we are soothed and restored, healed and renewed.
- People; In the darkness of sleep, dreams rise up. God spoke to Jacob and Joseph through dreams. God is speaking still.
- Leader: In the solitude of darkness, we sometimes remember those who need God's presence in a special way: The sick, the unemployed, the bereaved, the persecuted, the homeless,
- People: those who are demoralized and discouraged, those whose fear has turned to cynicism, those whose vulnerability has become bitterness.
- Leader: Sometimes in the darkness we remember those who are near to our hearts: colleagues, partners, parents, children, neighbors, and friends.
- People: We thank God for their presence and ask God to bless and protect them in all that they do at home, at school, as they travel, at work, and at play.
- Leader: Sometimes in the solitude of darkness, our fears and concerns, our hopes and our visions rise to the surface. We come face to face with ourselves and the road that lies ahead of us. And in that same darkness, we find companionship for the journey.

People: In that same darkness, we sometimes allow ourselves to wonder and worry whether the human race is going to make it at all.

Presider: We know you are with us, O God, yet we still await your second coming. In the darkness that contains both our bleakness and our expectancy, we watch for a sign of your hope and your light. We give you thanks for Jesus who is our light and our life. **Amen.**

Presider: It is right, and a good and joyful thing, always and everywhere to give thanks to you, Father Almighty, Creator of heaven and earth.

Because you gave Jesus Christ, your only Son to be born for us, who, by the mighty power of the Holy Spirit, was made perfect Man of the flesh of the Virgin Mary his mother, so that we might be delivered from the bondage of sin and receive power to become your children.

Therefore we praise you, joining our voices with Angels and Archangels and with all the company of heaven, who for ever sing this hymn to proclaim the glory of your Name:

The people stand, sit, or kneel.

We give thanks to you, O God, for the goodness and love which you have made known to us in creation; in the calling of Israel to be your people; in your Word spoken through the prophets; and above all in the Word made flesh, Jesus, your Son.

For in these last days you sent him to be incarnate from the Virgin Mary, to be the Savior and Redeemer of the world. In him, you have delivered us from evil, and made us worthy to stand before you. In him, you have brought us out of error into truth, out of sin into righteousness, out of death into life.

On the night before he died for us, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread;

and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said,:

"Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

After supper he took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said,

"Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

Therefore, according to his command, O Father,

We remember his death, We proclaim his resurrection, We await his coming in glory;

And we offer our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving to you, O Lord of all; presenting to you, from your creation, this bread and this wine.

We pray you, gracious God, to send your Holy Spirit upon these gifts (+) that they may be the Sacrament of the Body of Christ and his Blood of the new Covenant.

Unite us to your Son in his sacrifice, that we may be acceptable through him, being sanctified (+) by the Holy Spirit.

In the fullness of time, put all things in subjection under your Christ, and bring us to that heavenly country where, with all your saints, we may enter the everlasting heritage of your sons and daughters; through Jesus Christ our Lord, the firstborn of all creation, the head of the Church, and the author of our salvation.

By him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honor and glory is yours, Almighty Father, now and forever. **AMEN.**

The Lord's Prayer:
