

Working Together, Sierra Vistans Bring Goodwill and Holiday Cheer

S WE MOVE INTO THE HOLIDAY SEASON, I like to reflect on what makes this time of year special, especially here in Sierra Vista.

Our parks, recreation, and special events staff work hard to honor and expand our City's holiday traditions, bringing a little winter magic to life. Lights are strung and busy families gather to celebrate as Veterans Memorial Park transforms for the Annual Tree Lighting and Holiday Market. The familiar faces of the Old World Santas lit on display, the big man himself making his local debut, and shoppers winding their way through the busy market have become hallmarks of the holidays here.

The Sierra Vista Community Band plays as people gather round and watch as the big tree is lit. Children ice skate nearby or play in snow—albeit manmade—giving them access to traditional holiday joys uncommon in the desert.

Experience Winter Magic all Month Long



HE CITY OF SIERRA VISTA'S EXPANDED holiday festivities return this year, transforming Veterans Memorial Park into a month-long destination for individuals and families looking to immerse themselves in holiday cheer.

The seasonal celebration will kick off with the Annual Tree Lighting and Holiday Market on Friday, December 1, from 4 to 9 p.m. and on Saturday, December 2, from 11 a.m. to 9 p.m. This event features holiday shopping from local vendors, children's activities, music, food for purchase, ice skating, the Old World Santas display, and visits from Mr. Claus himself each night! But the magic doesn't stop there—the Santas display, lights, and ice skating are available from December 1 through January 2, 2024!

Ice Skating

The City of Sierra Vista is bringing back a holiday favorite—the ice-skating rink! The rink will open in conjunction with the Annual Tree Lighting and Holiday Market on December 1, and be available to the public until January 2, 2024. The cost to skate is \$10 per person, per 55-minute block, and includes skate rental. There are also complimentary skater aids for kids and other first-time skaters available on a first-come, first-served basis. This unique feature coupled with the Annual Tree Lighting and Holiday Market and the Old World Santas display and holiday lights in the park, builds on our community's traditions while offering new experiences.

"We want to honor our community's holiday traditions while we enhance and expand them, so the magic lingers all month long," City Parks, Recreation, and Library Director Laura Wilson says. "We want to make Veterans Memorial Park the place where residents and visitors can make holiday memories that last a lifetime."

The addition of more extraordinary activities has helped to draw in visitors from surrounding areas. Last year, over 32,000 people visited the center of Veterans Memorial Park throughout the month. Individuals, families, and groups enjoyed the holiday displays and skating on real ice—many for the first time! The majority were area residents, but many people also traveled from places like Tucson, Bisbee, Benson, and Tombstone to enjoy the festivities.

"These uncommon recreational opportunities make Sierra Vista a destination for the holiday season and help support the local economy," City Tourism and Economic Development Director Tony Boone says. "So not only do we get to offer exceptional experiences to our community, we're also helping our City and its businesses thrive."

The ice rink itself grossed over \$75,000 in revenue for the City last year, helping to cover the costs of bringing in this extraordinary recreational opportunity. The economic impact of attracting visitors gives a boost to local businesses, as folks from near and far patronize local establishments while out and about.

The Annual Tree Lighting and Holiday Market will take place in the center of Veterans Memorial Park on Friday, December 1, from 4 to 9 p.m. and on Saturday, December 2, from 11 a.m. to 9 p.m.

On Friday, December 1, the Sierra Vista Community Band will perform at 5 p.m. and the Tree Lighting Ceremony will take place at 5:30 p.m. Santa will arrive after the ceremony to meet local children and take their letters, while the holiday market, children's activities, and ice skating will remain open throughout.

On Saturday, King Crawdaddy and the Mudbugs will perform festive jazz music 'til noon. Between 5 to 8 p.m., the park entrances and exits will close for the Sierra Vista Area Chamber of Commerce's Christmas Light Parade, with a route encircling the park. Once the parade ends, Santa will visit once again as shopping, children's activities, and ice skating continue until 9 p.m.

Christmas Light Parade

EGISTRATION FOR THE SIERRA VISTA AREA Chamber of Commerce's Christmas Light Parade is open through November 22. This year's theme is "Christmas Around the World."

The parade will take place on Saturday, December 2, beginning at 5:30 p.m. It will start on Avenida Escuela, by the intersection of Martin Luther King, Jr. Parkway, heading south towards Fry Boulevard. The parade will then turn west on Fry Boulevard, proceeding past Veterans Memorial Park to Coronado Drive. The route will head northwest on Coronado Drive, continuing straight past the intersection of Moorman Avenue where Martin Luther King, Jr. Parkway begins. It will then continue along the parkway until it concludes at the intersection of Avenida Escuela.

The parade will be viewable along the southern border of Veterans Memorial Park on Fry Boulevard and from the northern border along Martin Luther King, Jr. Parkway. Please note, all entrances and exits to the park will be closed from 5 to 8 p.m. East Tacoma Avenue and Avenida Escuela north of Martin Luther King, Jr. Parkway will be closed for parade staging that day beginning at 3 p.m.

How to Help

Donations of new, unwrapped toys for kids newborn to 12 years of age and monetary contributions can be dropped off at any Sierra Vista Fire & Medical Services fire station until Friday, December 15. The department will also host three off-site toy donation drives on Wednesdays in the ACE Hardware parking lot from 4 to 6 p.m. on November 29, December 6, and December 13.

Firefighters need assistance in bagging and delivering items. This is a drop-in volunteer opportunity. No pre-registration is required.

Apply for Assistance

By partnering with the Southeastern Arizona Chamber Foundation and UACI, the City of Sierra Vista and its partners sponsor local businesses to have one-year access to UACI's incubator program. The program includes resources, services, and expert guidance to grow a business. This sponsorship also includes one year of office space at the Sierra Vista Industrial Development Authority (SVIDA).

Recycle Christmas Trees for Free



IVE PINE TREES CAN FILL HOMES WITH THE scent and spirit of the holiday season but too often Christmas trees end up in the landfill once the new year comes. This year, why not resolve to make Christmas a little greener by recycling that tree instead?

Starting Tuesday, January 2, Christmas trees without decorations can be recycled free of charge by dropping them off at the City's Compost Facility on Highway 90. The trees will be turned into high quality compost available for purchase by the truck load at the Compost Facility.

Please remember to remove all tinsel, lights, and

ornaments. Only live trees can be recycled, so do not drop off artificial trees. Christmas tree recycling will be available through Saturday, January 27, 2024. This free drop off service is available to all Cochise County residents.

City refuse customers also have the option to schedule a free curbside pickup for their tree by calling (520) 458-7530 by Monday at 5 p.m. for a Wednesday pickup. The next Wednesday when green waste pickups may be arranged is on January 10, 2023. These special Christmas tree pickups can also be scheduled by filling out a green waste pickup request form available at SierraVistaAZ.gov.

Prevent a **Plumbing Coronary**

Prevent a Plumbing Coronary Whether featuring turkey, ham, or both, holiday meals produce a lot of leftovers, including some used cooking grease that all too often makes its way down the drain.

In your pipes, this fat, oil, and grease cools and solidifies, creating blockages that can be costly for homeowners and for the City if they form in public pipes. Thankfully there's a way to put all that cooking fat, oil, and grease to good use!

The City enables residents to greasecycle by dropping off used cooking fat, oil, and grease in dry, sealed containers with secure lids at the Compost Facility located at 7201 E. Highway 90. Be sure to use a coffee filter and paper towel to remove the solid bits and residue. It will then be turned into biodiesel fuel!

The Compost Facility is located at 7201 E. Highway 90 (at mile marker 325, near the Cochise County Transfer Station). The Compost Facility is open Monday, Tuesday, and Thursday through Saturday from 8 a.m. to 2:30 p.m. The Compost Facility will be closed for Thanksgiving week starting Monday, November 20. It will reopen on Monday, November 27. It will also be closed the last week of the year beginning Monday, December 25. It will reopen on Tuesday, January 2, 2024.



Holiday Trash Pickup Changes

The trash pickup on Thursday, November 23, will shift to Wednesday, November 22, due to the Thanksgiving holiday. There will be no change to the Friday, November 24, pickup.

The trash pickups for Monday, December 25, and Tuesday, December 26, will be shifted one day later due to the observed Christmas holiday. The trash pickups for Monday, January 1, and Tuesday, January 2, 2024, will also shift one day later due to the observed New Year's Day holiday.

No special Wednesday pickups will be available these weeks.


