Holy Saturday 5pm:

Palm Sunday 10 am:

We celebrate on Palm Sunday Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem to shouts of "Hosana!" and "Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord!" We receive palm fronds and crosses as a reminder of his victorious recognition as the Messiah by his followers. However, the story moves quickly to his exit from the city to Calvary and his crucifixion.

Wednesday of Holy Week 6pm:

Join us as we retrace the steps of Jesus along the via Delarosa -The way of the cross - as we read aloud the "Stations of Hope".

This pilgrimage from station to station of Jesus' journey to his death carrying his cross, his crucifixion, and death invite us to reflect on what Jesus' last steps mean for us and our own pilgrimage on the earth.

Maundy Thursday 6pm:

Jesus' last supper and washing of his followers' feet. Jesus gives us a last commandment: to love one another as Jesus loves us. He washes feet to show his love and devotion for us and asks that we would do the same for one another. Come and let us wash your feet, then turn and wash another's feet following Christ's example. We close with stripping the altar/ sanctuary in silence in preparation for Good Friday

Good Friday 6pm:

A service reflecting on the last seven utterances of Christ from the Cross:

- Father, forgive them; they don't know what they are doing.
- Today you will be with me in paradise.
- Dear woman, here is your son; and (to the disciple) here is your mother.
- My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?
- I thirst.
- It is finished.
- Father, into your hands I commit my spirit.

We spend some time near the cross, leaving at Jesus' feet our own sorrows, guilt, and shame for the things we do or fail to do in life... We ask God to forgive us and renew a right spirit within us.
