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The First Lesson - A Reading from Ruth 3:1-18:

Naomi, Ruth's mother-in-law, said to her, "My daughter, am I not seeking respite for you, that will be good for you? Now is not Boaz our kin, with whose girls you have been? Look! He is winnowing barley on the threshing floor tonight. Now bathe and anoint yourself and put on your [best] clothes and go down to the threshing floor; do not make yourself known to the man until he has finished eating and drinking. When he lies down, note the place where he lies, and go and uncover his thighs and lie down, and he will tell you what you should do." Ruth said to Naomi, "All that you tell me I will do."

Then Ruth went down to the threshing floor and did just as her mother-inlaw commanded her. Now Boaz had eaten and drunk and his heart was content, and he went to lie down at the end of the heap [of grain]. Then Ruth came in secret and uncovered his thighs and lay down. At midnight the man trembled and turned and right there a woman was lying at his thighs! Then Boaz said, "Who are you?" And she said, "I am Ruth, your slave-woman; spread your cloak over your slave-woman, for you are a kin redeemer." And he said, "May you be blessed by the MOST HIGH, my daughter; your most recent act of fidelity is greater than the first; you have not gone after young men, whether poor or rich. And now, my daughter, fear not; all that you have spoken, I will do for you, for all the assembly of my people know you are a warrior-hearted woman. And now, it is true that I am a kin redeemer, there is a kin redeemer closer than I. Spend the night tonight and when morning comes, if he will redeem you as kin, good; let him redeem you. If he does not want to redeem you as kin, then, as the AGELESS GOD lives, I will redeem you as kin myself. Lie down until the morning."

So Ruth lay at his thighs until morning, but got up before one person could recognize a neighbor for Boaz said [to himself], "Let it not be known that the woman came to the threshing floor." Then he said, "Bring the cloak you are wearing and hold it out." So she held it and Boaz measured out six helpings of barley, and put it on her back; then he went into the city. And Ruth came to her mother-in-law and Naomi asked, "Who are you, my daughter?" And she told her all that the man had done for her. Ruth explained, "He gave these six helpings of barley to me, for he said, 'Do not go back to your mother-in-law empty-handed." She replied, "Wait, my daughter, until you learn how the matter will shake out, for the man will not rest, but will conclude the matter today."

The Second Lesson: A Reading from Paul's letter to the 2 Corinthians 9:6-13:

Now hear this: The one who sows sparingly, sparingly will also reap, and the one who sows in abundance, in abundance will also reap. Each one must give as decided in your heart, not out of reluctance or under pressure, for "God loves a cheerful giver." And the power of God is able to grant you all every gift abundantly, so that always having enough of everything, you all may abound in every good work. As it is written, "God scatters generously, and gives to the poor; God's righteousness endures forever."

The one who supplies seed to the sower and bread for food will supply and multiply your seed and increase the harvest of your righteousness. Enriched in every way for every kind of generosity which will yield through us thanksgiving to God, for the offering of this ministry does not only supply the needs of the saints but also overflows with many thanksgivings to God. Through the character of this ministry you all glorify God by your obedience to the confession of the gospel of Christ and by the generosity of your companionship with them and with all others..

Sermon (Rev Keith Saar)

Nicene Creed All say together (CONTEMPORARY VERSION)


People It is right to give God thanks and praise.

Glory and honor and praise to you, holy and living God. To deliver us from the power of sin and death and to reveal the riches of your grace, you looked with favor upon Mary, your willing servant, that she might conceive and bear a son, Jesus the holy child of God.
