

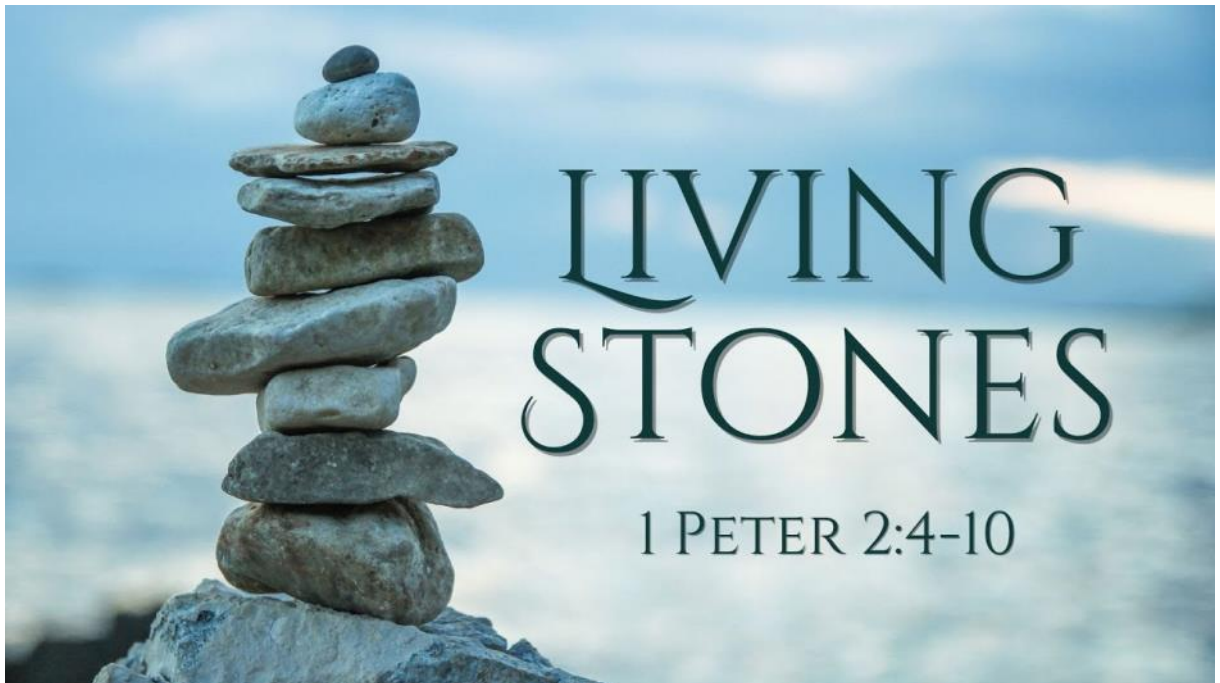

The First Lesson - A Reading from 1 Samuel 2:18-21, 26:

Now Samuel was ministering in the presence of the HOLY ONE OF OLD, a boy dressed in a linen ephod. A little robe would his mother make for him and bring up to him year by year, when she went up with her husband to offer the yearly sacrifice. And Eli would bless Elkanah and his wife, and say, "May the HOLY ONE repay you (Elkanah) with seed from this woman in place of the bequest she made to the FOUNT OF LIFE"; and then they would return to their home.

And the FAITHFUL ONE attended Hannah and she conceived and gave birth to two daughters and three sons. And the boy Samuel grew up there in the presence of the LIVING GOD.

Now the boy Samuel went on and grew in goodness with the MOST HIGH and with humanity.

The Second Lesson: A Reading from the book of 1 Peter 2:4-10:

Come to Jesus, a living stone, although rejected by humanity yet chosen and precious to God. And are yourselves, like living stones, being built into a spiritual house to be a holy priesthood, to offer spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ. Thus scripture contains the following:

"See, I am laying in Zion a stone, a cornerstone chosen, precious; and whoever believes in that stone will not be put to shame."

To you all who believe then, a precious honor; but for those who do not believe,

"The stone that the builders rejected has become the chief cornerstone,"

And "A stumbling stone, and a rock of offence."

They stumble over the word disobeying, disobedient by design. Yet you all are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, God's own possession, in order that you may proclaim the mighty acts of God who called you out of shadow into God's marvelous light. Once not a people, but now God's people; once bereft of mercy, but now rich in mercy.

Lector: Hear what the Spirit is saying to God's people.

People: Thanks be to God.

Gospel Lesson:

Deacon: The Holy Gospel of Our Lord Jesus Christ according to **Mark 7:10-13**

People: Glory to you, Lord Christ.

"Now Moses said, 'Honor your mother and your father' and 'Whoever speaks evil of mother or father must surely die.' But you all say that if anyone tells father or mother, 'A Korban—gift-offering to God—is whatever support you might have had from me.' Then, you all release them from any obligation for mother or father. Thus you all make void the word of God through your tradition that you all have handed on. And you all do many things like this."

Sermon

Nicene Creed All say together (CONTEMPORARY VERSION)

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father; through him all things were made.

For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven, was incarnate of the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary and became truly human.

For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father, who with the Father and the Son is worshiped and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets.

We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church.

We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins.

We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen

Leader: For all who have died in the hope of the resurrection,

People: **and for all the departed, let us pray to the Lord.**

Leader: For deliverance from all danger, violence, oppression, and degradation,

People: **For the absolution and remission of our sins and offenses, let us pray to the Lord.**

Leader: That we may end our lives in faith and hope,
People: **without suffering and without reproach, let us pray to the Lord.**

Leader: Defend us, deliver us, and in your compassion protect us, O Lord, with your grace.

People: **In the communion of all the saints, we commend ourselves, and one another, and all our life, to you Holy and Living God. Amen.**

Confession of Sin

Deacon: Let us confess our sins to God.

All: **God of all mercy, we confess that we have sinned against you, opposing your will in our lives. We have denied your goodness in each other, in ourselves, and in the world you have created. We repent of the evil that influences us, the evil we have done, and the evil done on our behalf. Forgive, restore, and strengthen us through our Savior Jesus Christ, that we may abide in your love and serve only your will. Amen.**

Presider: Almighty God have mercy on you, forgive you all your sins through the grace of Jesus Christ, strengthen you in all goodness, and by the power of the Holy Spirit keep you in eternal life. **Amen.**

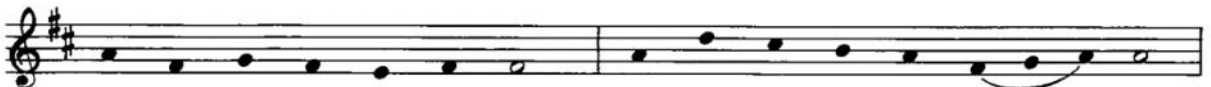

Glory and honor and praise to you, holy and living God. To deliver us from the power of sin and death and to reveal the riches of your grace, you

looked with favor upon Mary, your willing servant, that she might conceive and bear a son, Jesus the holy child of God.

Living among us, Jesus loved us.

He broke bread with outcasts and sinners, healed the sick, and proclaimed good news to the poor.

He yearned to draw all the world to himself; yet we were heedless of his call to walk in love.

Pour out your Spirit upon these gifts that they may be the Body and Blood of Christ. Breathe your Spirit over the whole earth and make us your new Creation (+), the Body of Christ given for the world you have made.

In the fullness of time bring us, with St. Stephen and all your saints, from every tribe and language and people and nation, to feast at the banquet prepared from the foundation of the world.

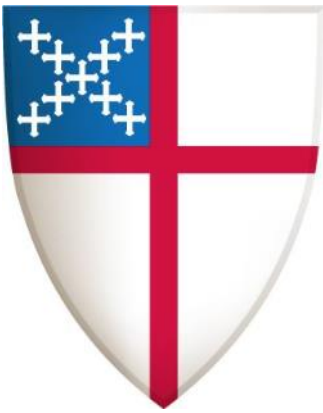
