The First Lesson - A Reading from Ruth 4:9-17:

Then Boaz said to the elders and all the people, "Today you are witnesses that I am acquiring all that belonged to Elimelech and all that belonged to Chilion and Mahlon from the hand of Naomi. Also, Ruth the Moabite, the wife of Mahlon am I acquiring for myself as a wife to maintain the dead man's name

on his inheritance, to reestablish the name of the deceased on his heritable property, that it may not be cut off from his kin and from the gate of his native place; today you are witnesses."

All the women and men who were at the gate, along with the elders, said, "We are witnesses. May the FAITHFUL GOD grant that the woman who is coming into your house be like Rachel and Leah; the two of them built up the house of Israel. May you prosper in Ephrathah and establish a lineage in Bethlehem; and may your house, through the children that the FOUNT OF LIFE will give you by this young woman, be like the house of Perez, whom Tamar gave birth to for Judah."

So Boaz took Ruth as his own for a wife. He came to her and the SOURCE OF LIFE granted her a pregnancy, and she gave birth to a son. Then the women said to Naomi, "Blessed be the FAITHFUL GOD, who has not deprived you this day of next of-kin; and may the child's name be renowned in Israel! He shall be to you a restorer of life and a provider in your latter years; for your daughter-in-law has given birth to him, she who loves you, she who is more to you than seven sons." Then Naomi took the child and laid him in her bosom, and she fostered him. The neighbor-women gave him a name, saying, "A son has been born to Naomi." They named him Obed; he became the father of Jesse, the father of David."

The Psalm -

Psalm 107:1-9, 19-22: (read responsively by verse)

- 1 Give thanks to SHE WHO IS MAJESTY, for she is good, and her faithful love endures forever.
- 2 Let the redeemed of SHE WHO SAVES proclaim that she redeemed them from the hand of the foe.
- 3 And she has gathered them from all the lands; from the east and from the west.

from the north and from the south.

- 4 They wandered in the wilderness, in the desert; no path to a city fit for settling did they find.
- 5 They were hungry and thirsty; their souls fainted within them.
- 6 Then they cried to SHE WHO HEARS in their trouble, and from their distress she delivered them.

- 7 And she led them on a straight path to a city fit for settling.
- 8 Let them give thanks to WOMB OF LIFE for her faithful love and her wonderful works for the woman-born.
- 9 For she satisfies the thirsty soul and the hungry souls she fills with goodness.

- 21 Let them give thanks to the WOMB OF LIFE for her faithful love and wonderful works for the woman-born.
- 22 Let them sacrifice sacrifices of thanksgiving and tell other acts with shouts of joy.

The Second Lesson: A Reading from Paul's letter to the 1 Corinthians 12:14-26:

Now look, the body is not a single part but rather, many. If the foot says, "Because I am not a hand, I am not part of the body," is it then, not of the body? And if the ear says, "Because I am not an eye, I am not part of the body," is it then, not of the body?

If the whole body were an eye, where would be the hearing? If the whole body were hearing, where would be the smelling? Thus it is that God has designated the parts of the body, each of them, according to the will of God. If all were a single part, where would be the body? Thus, it is that there are many parts, yet one body.

The eye cannot say to the hand, "I have no use for you," nor again the head to the feet, "I have no use for you." Rather, on the contrary, the parts of the body that seem to be weaker are indispensable. And those parts of the body that we think dishonorable we clothe with more honor, and our unpresentable parts are treated with more decorum. However, our more respectable parts do not need such.

Yet God has so composed the body, giving the more honor to the lesser part, that there may be no division within the body, rather that the parts may have the same concern for one another. And if one part suffers, all suffer together with it; if one part is honored, all rejoice together with it.

Gospel Lesson:

Deacon: The Holy Gospel of Our Lord Jesus Christ according to

Matthew 5:43-48

"You all have heard that it was said, 'You shall love your neighbor and hate your enemy.' Yet I say to you all: Love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you, so that you may be children of the One in heaven who begot you; for the sun—which belongs to God—rises on the evil and on the good, and God rains on the righteous and on the unrighteous woman or man. For if you all love those who love you, what reward do you have? Do not even the tax collectors do the same? And if you greet only your sisters and brothers, what more are you doing than others? Do not the Gentiles do the same? Be perfect, therefore, as your heavenly Sovereign is perfect.

Presentation of Candidates to be Received:


Presider Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

People It is right to give God thanks and praise.

Presider: We praise you and we bless you, holy and gracious God, source of life abundant. From before time you made ready the creation. Your Spirit moved over the deep and brought all things into being: sun, moon, and stars; earth, winds, and waters; and every living thing.

People: You made us in your image, and taught us to walk in your ways. But we rebelled against you, and wandered far away; and yet, as a mother cares for her children, you would not forget us. Time and again you called us to live in the fullness of your love.

Presider: And so this day we join with Saints and Angels in the chorus of praise that rings through eternity, lifting our voices to magnify you as we sing (say):



Bless - ed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Ho-san- na in the high - est.

Glory and honor and praise to you, holy and living God. To deliver us from the power of sin and death and to reveal the riches of your grace, you looked with favor upon Mary, your willing servant, that she might conceive and bear a son, Jesus the holy child of God.

Living among us, Jesus loved us.

He broke bread with outcasts and sinners, healed the sick, and proclaimed good news to the poor.

He yearned to draw all the world to himself; yet we were heedless of his call to walk in love.

Then, the time came for him to complete upon the cross the sacrifice of his life, and to be glorified by you. On the night before he died for us, Jesus was at table with his friends.
