


Saint Stephen's welcomes everyone who wishes to follow Christ, worship together, grow in faith and share God's love through service to others.

The Word of God—(*Please be seated for the reading of the lessons*)

First Lesson: 1 Samuel 14:49-51, 18:17-21, 29

Now the sons of Saul were Jonathan, Ishvi, and Malchishua, and the names of his two daughters, the name of the firstborn was Merab, and the name of the

younger, Michal. The name of Saul's wife was Ahinoam daughter of AHIMA, and the name of the commander of his army was Abner son of Ner, Saul's uncle. Kish was the father of Saul and Ner the father of Abner was the son of Abiel.

Then Saul said to David, "Look, here is my older daughter Merab. I will give her to you as a wife; only be my valiant warrior and fight the battles of the HOLY ONE." For Saul said to himself, "Let me not raise a hand against him, rather let the hand of the Philistines do it." Then David said to Saul, "Who am I and what is my lineage, my ancestral house in Israel, that I should be son-in-law to the ruler of Israel?" But at the time for giving Merab the daughter of Saul to David, it happened that she was given to Adriel the Meholathite as a wife. Now at the same time Saul's daughter Michal loved David. Saul was told, and the matter was all right in his eyes. So Saul said to himself, "Let me give Michal to David that she may be a snare for him and that the hand of the Philistines may be against him." So, Saul said to David a second time, "Through the second shall you be my son-in-law this day."

And Saul came to fear David more and Saul became the enemy of David every day from then.

Reader The Word of the Lord

Psalm 31:1-7, 14-16, 19-24:

- 1 In you, WOMB OF LIFE, I take refuge; let me not ever be put to shame; in your righteousness rescue me.
- 2 Incline your ear to me; quickly deliver me. Be for me a rock of refuge, a stronghold to save me.
- 3 For you are my rock and my stronghold; for your Name's sake lead me and guide me.
- 4 Free me from the net that is hidden for me, for you are my refuge.
- 5 Into your hand I commit my spirit; you have redeemed me, ARK OF SAFETY, God of truth.

- 6 I hate those who attend to worthless vanity, but in the MOTHER OF ALL I place my trust.
- 7 I will exult and I will rejoice in your faithful love, because you have seen my affliction; you have studied my soul's sorrows.

- 15 My times are in your hand; deliver me from the hand of my enemies and those who hound me.

- 19 How great is your goodness that you have secured for those who fear you, and that you do for those who take refuge in you, before all the woman-born.
- 20 In the shelter of your presence you shelter them from human plots; you hide them safe under your shelter from contentious tongues.
- 21 Blessed be the MOTHER OF CREATION, who is marvelous in her faithful love to me,

- 22 Now I, I had said in my alarm,
 "I am cut off from your sight."
 However, you heard my
 supplications
 when I cried to you for help.

Second Lesson: Romans 13:8-10:

Owe no one anything, except to love one another; for the one who loves another has fulfilled the law. The commandments, "You shall not commit adultery; You shall not murder; You shall not steal; You shall not covet, " and any other commandment, are summed up in this word, "Love your neighbor as yourself." Love does no harm to a neighbor; therefore, love is the fulfilling of the law.

Gospel Lesson:

Deacon: The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Mark (12:28-34)

People: Glory to you, Lord Christ.

Now, one of the biblical scholars came near and heard them the other biblical scholars, the chief priests, and the elders discussing with one another, and seeing that Jesus answered them well, the scholar asked Jesus, "Which commandment is the first of all?"

Jesus answered, "The first is: Hear, O Israel: The Holy One our God, the Holy is one; you shall love the Holy One your God with all your heart, and with

all your soul, and with all your mind, and with all your strength. The second is this, you shall love your neighbor as yourself. There is no other commandment greater than these."

Then the biblical scholar said to him, "You are right, Teacher; you have truly said that 'God is one, and besides God there is no other'; and to love God with all the heart, and with all the understanding, and with all the strength, and to love one's neighbor as oneself. This is much more important than all whole burnt offerings and sacrifices."

When Jesus saw that the scholar answered wisely, he said, "You are not far from the reign of God." After that no one dared to ask Jesus any question.

SERMON

Nicene Creed (Traditional)

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father. Through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven: by the power of the Holy Spirit he became incarnate from the Virgin Mary, and was made man.

For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son. With the Father and the Son he is worshiped and glorified. He has spoken through the Prophets.

We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church.

We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins.

We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.

By your will they were created and have their being.

From the primal elements you brought forth the human race, and blessed us with memory, reason, and skill. You made us the rulers of creation.

But we turned against you, and betrayed your trust; and we turned against one another.


Have mercy, Lord, for we are sinners in your sight.

Again and again, you called us to return. Through prophets and sages you revealed your righteous Law. And in the fullness of time you sent your only Son, born of a woman, to fulfill your Law, to open for us the way of freedom and peace.

The Presider continues

And so, Father, we who have been redeemed by him, and made a new people by water and the Spirit, now bring before you these gifts. Sanctify them by your Holy Spirit (+) to be the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ our Lord.

On the night he was betrayed he took bread, said the blessing, broke the bread, and gave it to his friends, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

After supper, he took the cup of wine, gave thanks, and said, "Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

Remembering now his work of redemption, and offering to you this sacrifice of thanksgiving:

We celebrate his death and resurrection, as we await the day of his coming.

Lord God of our Fathers: God of Sarah and Abraham, Rebekah and Isaac, Rachel and Jacob; God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ: Open our eyes to see your hand at work in the world about us. Deliver us from the presumption of coming to this Table for solace only, and not for strength; for pardon only, and not for renewal. Let the grace of this Holy Communion make us one body, one spirit in Christ, that we may worthily serve the world in his name.

Risen Lord, be known to us in the breaking of the Bread.

Accept these prayers and praises, Father, through Jesus Christ our great High Priest, to whom, with you and the Holy Spirit, your Church gives honor, glory, and worship, from generation to generation. **AMEN.**

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy Name, thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven.


