The Lessons: (Please be seated for the reading of the lessons)

First Lesson: Isaiah 25: 1, 4a, 6-10a:

HOLY ONE OF OLD, you are my God; I will exalt you, I will praise your name, for you have worked wonders, ancient counsel, faithful and trustworthy. For you are a refuge to the poor, a refuge to the needy in their distress, a shelter from the storm and a shade from the heat.

The COMMANDER of heaven's legions will make for all peoples on this mountain a feast of rich food, a feast of well-aged wines, of rich food prepared with marrow, of refined well-aged wines. And God will destroy on this mountain the shroud that shrouds all peoples, the veil that veils all nations. God will swallow up death forever.

Then the SOVEREIGN God will wipe away tears from every face and will sweep aside the shame of God's people from the whole earth, for GOD WHOSE NAME IS HOLY has spoken. It will be said on that day, Look! This is our God; in whom we hope, and who saved us. This is the CREATOR OF ALL in whom we hope; let us be glad and rejoice in God's salvation. For the hand of the ANCIENT OF DAYS shall rest on this mountain.

Reader: The Word of the Lord **People: Thanks be to God**

Second Lesson: Romans 15:7-13:

Accept one another, therefore, just as Christ has accepted you, for the glory of God. I tell you that the Messiah has become a servant of the circumcised for the sake of truth to confirm the promises given to the mothers and fathers, and in order that the Gentiles might glorify God on account of God's mercy. As it is written,

"Therefore, I will confess you among the Gentiles, and sing praises to your name," and again, Isaiah says,

"The root of Jesse shall come, and the one who rises to rule the Gentiles, in whom the Gentiles shall hope."

May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace in believing, so that you may abound in hope by the power of the Holy Spirit.

Gospel Lesson:

Deacon: The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to

Matthew (27:50-56:)

Jesus cried again with a loud voice and relinquished his spirit. Then, look! The curtain of the temple was torn from top to bottom in two. And the earth was shaken, and the rocks were split. And the tombs were opened, and many bodies of the saints who had fallen asleep were raised. Then after his resurrection they came out of the tombs and entered the holy city and appeared to many.

Now when the centurion and those with him, who were standing guard over Jesus, saw the earthquake and what took place, they were terrified and said, "Truly this man was God's Son!"

Now there were many women there, from a distance watching; they had followed Jesus from Galilee and had ministered to him. Among them were Mary the Magdalene, and Mary the mother of James and Joseph, and the mother of the sons of Zebedee.

Presider

It is right indeed to give you thanks most loving God, through Jesus Christ, our Redeemer, the first born from the dead, the pioneer of our salvation, who is with us always, one of us, yet from the heart of God.

For with your whole created universe, we praise you for your unfailing gift of life. We thank you that you made us in your image and stay with us even when we turn from you to sin.

God's love is shown to us: in that while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us.

In that love, dear God, righteous and strong to save, you came among us in Jesus Christ, our crucified and living Lord.

You make all things new. In Christ's suffering and cross you reveal your glory and reconcile all peoples to yourself, the true and living God. Through Christ you gather us, new-born in your Spirit, a people after your own heart. We entrust ourselves to you and your mercy, for you alone judge all people, living and departed.

Now is the acceptable time, now is the day of salvation.

Therefore with saints and martyrs, apostles and prophets, with all the redeemed, joyfully we praise you and say:

"Take, eat, this is my body which is given for you; do this to remember me."

After supper he took the cup; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them and said:

"Drink this, all of you. This is my blood of the new covenant which is shed for you, and for many, to forgive sin. Do this as often as you drink it to remember me."

Therefore, God of all creation, in the suffering and death of Jesus our redeemer, we meet you in your glory. We lift up the cup of salvation and call upon your name. Here and now, with this bread and wine, we celebrate your great acts of liberation, ever present and living in Jesus Christ, crucified and risen, who was and is and is to come.

Through Christ, in the power of the Holy Spirit, with all who stand before you in earth and heaven, we worship you, Creator God. AMEN.


Presider: Let us pray together the New Zealand form of the Lord's Prayer:


Invitation to Communion:

Deacon: Let us go forth into the world, rejoicing in God's Spirit. Alleluia! Alleluia!


