First Lesson - A Reading from the book of 2nd Samuel 13:1-16,21-22:

Now it was after the defeat of the Ammonites. The sister of Absalom,

David's son, was beautiful; her name was Tamar and Amnon son of David loved her. Amnon was distressed to the point of sickness over Tamar his sister, for she was a virgin and it seemed impossible in his eyes to do anything to her. Now Amnon had a friend whose name was Jonadab, the son of Shimeah David's brother, and Jonadab was an extremely astute man. He said to Amnon, "Why are you so poorly royal son, morning after morning? Will you not tell me?" Amnon said to him, "Tamar, sister of Absalom my brother, I love her."

Jonadab said to Amnon, "Lie down on your bed and make yourself sick and your father will come to see you, then say to him, 'Please let Tamar my sister come and feed me bread and prepare the food before my eyes so I may see it and eat it from her hand." So Amnon lay down and made himself sick and when the king came to see him, Amnon said to the king, "Please let Tamar my sister come and make heart-cakes before my eyes that I may eat from her hand."

Then David sent Tamar to the palace saying, "Go to the house of your brother Amnon and prepare food for him." So, Tamar went to the house of Amnon her brother; he was lying down. And she took dough and kneaded it and made heart-cakes in his sight and cooked the cakes. Then she took the pan and tipped them out before him, but he refused to eat. Then Amnon said, "Send everyone out away from me." So everyone went out away from him.

Then Amnon said to Tamar, "Bring the food into the room that I may eat from your hand." So Tamar took the heart-cakes she had made and brought them into the room to Amnon her brother. And she brought them to him to eat and he seized her and said to her, "Come, lie with me, my sister." She said to him, "No! Do not my brother! Do not rape me! Such a thing is not done in Israel! Do not commit this sacrilege! And I, where could I go with my shame? And as for you, you would be as one of the outcasts in Israel. Now please, speak to the king; for he will not withhold me from you." He did not want to listen to her voice; he overpowered her, and he raped her and lay with her.

Then Amnon hated her with a very great hatred, for greater was his hatred toward her than his love of her, so Amnon said to her, "Get up! Get out!" But she said to him, "No, this great evil, sending me away, is more than what you did to me." And he would not listen to her.

And the king, David, heard of all these things and he became very angry, yet he would not grieve the spirit of Amnon his son, because he loved him, for he was his firstborn. Now Absalom spoke not to Amnon neither ill nor well for Absalom hated Amnon, because of that deed—he raped Tamar his sister.

The Psalm - Psalm 103:1-17

- 1 Bless the FOUNT OF WISDOM, O my soul, and all that is within me, bless her holy Name.
- 2 Bless the FOUNT OF WISDOM, O my soul, and forget not all her benefits.
- 3 She forgives all your sins and heals all your infirmities;
- 4 She redeems your life from the grave and crowns you with mercy and lovingkindness;
- 5 She satisfies you with good things, and your youth is renewed like an eagle's.
- 6 SHE WHO IS WISDOM executes righteousness and judgment for all who are oppressed.
- 7 She made her ways known to Miriam and Moses and her works to the children of Israel.
- 8 WISDOM'S womb is full of love and faithfulness, slow to anger and overflowing with faithful love.
- 9 She will not always accuse us, nor will she keep her anger forever.

- 10 She has not dealt with us according to our sins, nor rewarded us according to our wickedness.
- 11 For as the heavens are high above the earth, so indomitable is her faithful love upon those who revere her.
- 12 As far as the east is from the west, so far has she removed our sins from us.
- 13 As a mother's love for her children flows from her womb, so too does WISDOM'S love for those who revere her flow from her womb.
- 14 For she herself knows whereof we are made;
 She remembers that we are but dust.
- 15 Our days are like the grass; we flourish like a flower of the field:
- 16 When the wind goes over it, it is gone, and its place shall know it no more.
- 17 But the faithful love of SHE WHO IS WISDOM endures forever on those who revere her, and her righteousness on children's children.

Second Lesson - A Reading from Paul's Letter, 1 Thessalonians 2:9-12:

You all remember, sisters and brothers, our labor and our toil; night and day we worked, so that we might not be a financial burden to any of you while we

proclaimed to you the gospel of God. You all are witnesses, with God, how holy, just, and blameless was our conduct toward you believers. As you all know, we dealt with each one of you like a parent with children, urging and encouraging you and pleading that you lead a life worthy of God, who calls you into God's own realm and glory.

People: Thanks be to God.

Deacon: The Holy Gospel of Our Lord Jesus Christ according to

Mark (10: 13-16:)

Now people were bringing little children to Jesus in order that he might touch them, and the disciples rebuked them. But when Jesus saw this, he was angry and said to them, "Let the little children come to me, do not prevent them; for it is to such as these that the realm of God belongs. Truly I tell you all, whoever does not receive the reign of God as a little child will never enter it." And Jesus took them up in his arms, laid his hands on them, and blessed them.

Sermon

Nicene Creed All say together (CONTEMPORARY VERSION)


People It is right to give our thanks and praise.


