Therese of Lisieux OCD (French: Thérèse de Lisieux [teʁɛz də lizjø]; born Marie Françoise-Thérèse Martin; 2 January 1873 – 30 September 1897), religious name Therese of the Child Jesus and the Holy Face (Thérèse de l'Enfant Jésus et de la Sainte Face), was a French Discalced Carmelite who is widely venerated in modern times. She is popularly known in English as the Little Flower of Jesus, or simply the Little Flower, and in French as la petite Thérèse ("little Therese"). [2][3]

Therese has been a highly influential model of sanctity for Catholics and for others because of the simplicity and practicality of her approach to the spiritual life. She is one of the most popular saints in the history of the church, [4][5] although she was obscure during her lifetime. [6] Pope Pius X called her "the greatest saint of modern times". [7][8]

The Word of God —(Please be seated for the reading of the lessons) First Lesson: Iudith 8:1-8

Now in those days Judith heard about these things: she was the daughter of Merari son of Ox son of Joseph son of Oziel son of Elkiah son of Ananias son of Gideon son of Raphain son of Ahitub son of Elijah son of Hilkiah son of Eliab son of Nathanael son of Salamiel son of Sarasadai son of Israel. Her husband Manasseh, who belonged to her tribe and family, had died during the barley harvest. For as he stood overseeing those who were binding sheaves in the field, he was overcome by the burning heat, and took to his bed and died in his town Bethulia. So they buried him with his ancestors in the field between Dothan and Balamon. Judith remained as a widow for three years and four months at home where she set up a tent for herself on the roof of her house. She put sackcloth around her waist and dressed in widow's clothing. She fasted all the days of her widowhood, except the day before the sabbath and the sabbath itself, the day before the new moon and the day of the new moon, and the festivals and days of rejoicing of the house of Israel. She was beautiful in appearance, and was very lovely to behold. Her husband Manasseh had left her gold and silver, men and women slaves, livestock, and fields; and she maintained this estate. No one spoke ill of her, for she feared God with great devotion.

SERMON

Nicene Creed (Traditional)

From the primal elements you brought forth the human race, and blessed us with memory, reason, and skill. You made us the rulers of creation.


But we turned against you, and betrayed your trust; and we turned against one another.

On the night he was betrayed he took bread, said the blessing, broke the bread, and gave it to his friends, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

Therese felt an early <u>call to religious life</u> and, after overcoming various obstacles, in 1888, at the early age of 15, ^[9] she became a nun and joined two of her elder sisters in the <u>cloistered</u> Carmelite community of <u>Lisieux</u>, <u>Normandy</u> (another sister, Céline, also later joined the order). After nine years as a Carmelite nun, having fulfilled various offices such as <u>sacristan</u> and assistant to the <u>novice mistress</u>, in her last eighteen months in Carmel she fell into a <u>night of faith</u>, in which she is said to have felt Jesus was absent and been tormented by doubts that God existed. Therese died at the age of 24 from tuberculosis.

After her death, Therese became known globally through her spiritual memoir, *The Story of a Soul*, which explains her theology of the "Little Way". As a result of her immense popularity and reputation for holiness, she was quickly beatified and canonized by <u>Pope Pius XI</u>, who completed the process just 28 years after her death. In 1997, <u>Pope John Paul II</u> declared her a <u>Doctor of the Church</u>. Her <u>feast day</u> in the <u>General Roman Calendar</u> was 3 October from 1927 until it was moved in 1969 to 1 October. She is well known throughout the world, with the <u>Basilica of Lisieux</u> being the second most popular place of pilgrimage in France after <u>Lourdes</u>.

Life: Family background

Zélie Martin, mother of Therese


Therese was born on Rue Saint-Blaise, in <u>Alençon</u>, France on 2 January 1873, and was the daughter of <u>Marie-Azélie Guérin</u> (usually called Zélie), and <u>Louis Martin</u> who was a jeweler and watchmaker. Both her parents were devout Catholics who would eventually become the first (and to date only) married couple canonized together by the <u>Roman Catholic Church</u> (by Pope Francis in 2015).

Louis had tried to become a <u>canon regular</u>, wanting to enter the <u>Great St Bernard Hospice</u>, but had been refused because he did not know <u>Latin</u>. Zélie, possessed of a strong, active temperament, wished to serve the sick, and had also considered entering <u>consecrated life</u>, but the <u>prioress</u> of the <u>canonesses regular</u> of the Hôtel-Dieu in Alençon had discouraged her outright. Disappointed, Zélie learned <u>lacemaking</u> instead. She excelled in it and set up her own business on Rue Saint-Blaise at age 22.

Louis and Zélie met in early 1858 and married on July 13 of that same year at the <u>Basilica of Notre-Dame d'Alençon</u>. At first they decided to live as brother and sister in a <u>perpetual continence</u>, but when a confessor discouraged them in this, they changed their lifestyle and had nine children. From 1867 to 1870, they lost 3 infants and five-year-old Hélène. All five of their surviving daughters became nuns. In addition to Therese, they were:

- Marie (February 22, 1860, a Carmelite in Lisieux, in religion Sister Marie of the Sacred Heart, d. January 19, 1940),
- Pauline (September 7, 1861, a Carmelite in Lisieux, in religion Mother Agnes of Jesus, d. July 28, 1951),
- <u>Léonie</u> (June 3, 1863, a <u>Visitandine</u> at <u>Caen</u>, in religion Sister Françoise-Thérèse, d. June 16, 1941), and
- <u>Céline</u> (April 28, 1869, a Carmelite in Lisieux, in religion Sister Geneviève of the Holy Face, d. February 25, 1959).
