## From our Rector



"Praise be to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ! In his great mercy he has given us new birth into a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead" - 1 Peter 1: 3

Joy and Hope to you all,

As we enter April, we approach our annual remembrance of Jesus' Last Supper, Crucifixion, and ultimately his unforgettable resurrection. The early church celebrates these notable events in spring which happily shows-off nature's own form of resurrection as the barren trees and fields come to life with buds, flowers, and green leaves. Any maybe even within ourselves a similar experience of rebirth, renewal, and restoration begins with nature's encouragement to allow new growth to take place in our hearts, souls, and lives.

There is much happening in the world right now and quite a bit of it seems precarious and threatening to the stability that we had before this new year began. Two things come to mind for me as I witness the turbulence that is taking place around us: 1) You don't know what you've got --- until it's gone. And 2) For everything under heaven there is a season... Sometimes we have to lose something to recognize how precious and valuable it was. And perhaps its loss inspires us to take action ... a time to die and a time to be born.



Hope springs eternal, Rev. Allison Cornell Palm Sunday 13 April – In liturgical churches like the Episcopal Church, Palm Sunday is a bit strange because we enter to "Hail! Hosanna! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord!" celebrating Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem as the Messiah and halfway through the service we are shouting "Crucify him!" as we read the Passion narrative of Jesus' last day alive on earth. The church does this for the benefit of anyone who cannot attend Holy Week services of Maundy Thursday and Good Friday... so that we may observe Jesus' crucifixion before the following Easter Resurrection Sunday. Come and receive your blessed Palms and prepare for Holy Week and Easter.


Maundy Thursday Agape Meal 17 April 6pm – Join us as we come together to recall Jesus' institution of his Last Supper with a "love feast" or Agape meal. We will share food items that Jesus may have shared with his friends on that last night with them as they celebrated Passover. The parish hall will be rearranged and decorated with candles and place-settings to share our first part of our evening together. We will have our communion here. Then at the peace, we will go into the church for some last prayers and the stripping of the altar before departing in silence.



Good Friday service with veneration of the cross 18 April 6pm – We take time to remember how Jesus, who did nothing wrong or illegal, was arrested, beaten, tortured, and sentenced to death through a perversion of justice... and Jesus did not resist, did not run way, but accepted his death for us. That we might witness his love of God and God's people and be inspired to live a life that imitated Jesus' own.



Easter Newcomer Celebration and Baptism Service! On Easter Sunday we will recognize with a short ceremony those who are newer attendees in our church and we will also offer the opportunity to be baptized and renew of our own baptismal vows as we celebrate Jesus' rising to new life and his promise to us for the same resurrection in Christ's name. Be sure to let others know we baptize folks of all ages and if they want to be baptized to come on Easter Sunday. You are never too old and it is never too late to be baptized!



**Easter Brunch following the Easter Service** – Join us for an Easter Feast after our Easter Sunday service. Ham, devilled eggs, potatoes, veggies, desserts, and mimosas! # From Our Reverend Deacon

On Thursday, March 13<sup>th</sup>, I attended the open house at the newly refurbished Good Neighbor Alliance Center on 7<sup>th</sup> Street. It houses homeless people in Sierra Vista.

The first thing I noticed as we were touring the main building, was the absolute efficiency in setting up areas for men and women. Everything there is brand new, from the heavy-duty bunk beds, to the mattresses, bedding, laundry area and bathroom/shower. The women's bathroom also has a tub for easy bathing of children. Attractive flooring and fresh paint on all walls. There is room for 8 men and 10 women - any children are housed with their parent. The dining room and kitchen are equipped with all new

furniture, appliances and storage cabinets. The area organizations funded and helped do all the renovation. Even a former Diamondback baseball player came to paint outside of building. Area church groups and others volunteer on a regular basis to make meals in the kitchen for residents. The hope is to have the shelter open 24/7 in the near future. Currently the residents must be out of the building by a certain time in the morning and back no later than 6pm. There are other restrictions including no

smoking, alcohol consumption or drugs in the complex or when arriving back at end of day. If any is detected they are not allowed to re-enter for a specific time.

Some property has been donated to build several tiny houses near the Forgach House, to accommodate women and even men who are abused. We were offered a tour of the Forgach House which I also took. It is also a lovely well-appointed building with rooms for women and children. At the end of a long hallway in the bedroom area is room for two men. Both areas have full bathrooms and storage shelves/closet for personal items.

There is an area for meals, cooked and served only by the employees. Another room is dedicated for all those being brought in, mostly by local police and other authorities for medical exams and legal paper work. Outdoors there is a private play area for the children, closely monitored for their safety. In time there will be outdoor seating under a shade tree or awning.

The Diocesan Auditor met with the Rector and Treasurer by Zoom early in March to discuss the process by which money is handled at St. Stephen's. Since several different people access information in several different ways, she seemed to be content with that. Any money that comes to us goes through the Teller teams for input to the computerized Teller Sheets. The Parish Administrator checks those. The Treasurer pays the bills from the account, and collects the bank receipts that confirm the Teller Sheets. And our bookkeeper is outsourced to provide reports to the Vestry. After that meeting, she requested reports from a number of specific areas. The process may take a couple of months. Meanwhile, we desperately need more tellers to help us with the income. If you have computer skills and/or are willing simply to second the count, please let us know.
