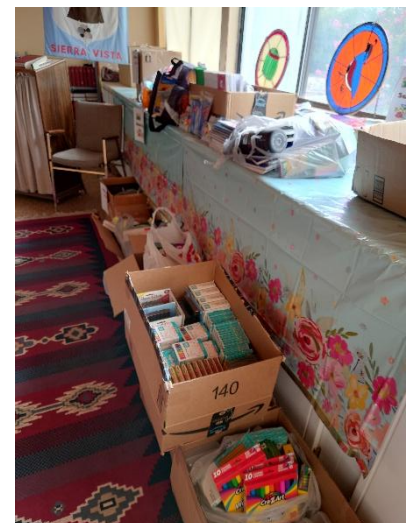
Our land and buildings

Both buildings have been recently painted. The parking lot has been resurfaced and painted with parking space lines and is lit by new LED lights.

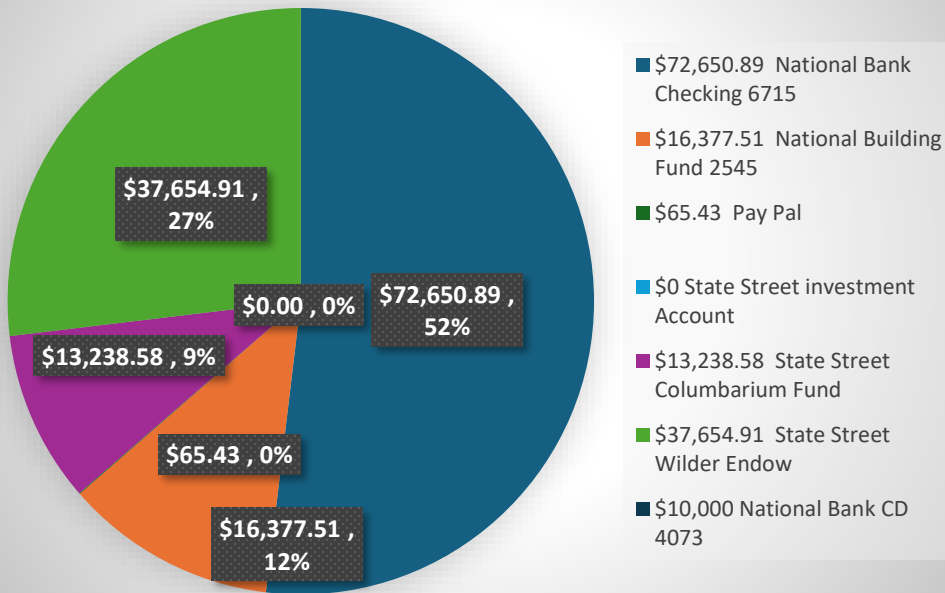

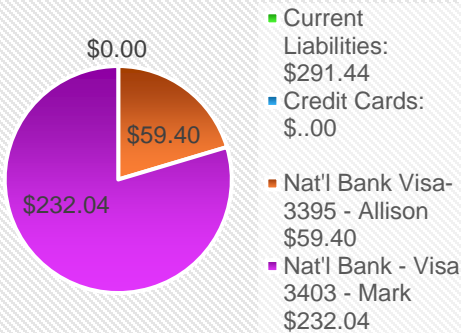

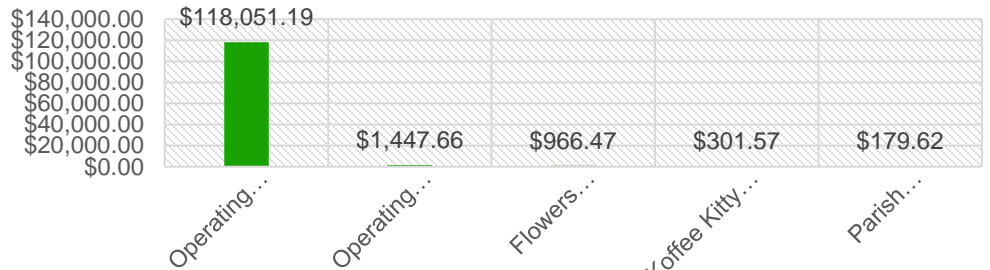

OUR HISTORY

A RECENT HISTORY OF ST. STEPHEN'S EPISCOPAL CHURCH IN SIERRA VISTA, ARIZONA

The push for a mission in Sierra Vista started in the mid-1950s. Officially founded and built in 1960, St. Stephen's became a Parish in 1992. We have returned to mission status as of June 2025 and are looking for a vicar to guide us toward being a parish again. St. Stephen's has

enjoyed a rather stable period since the mid-2000s. We have had 12 official vicars and/or rectors since 1958, with an average stay of a little more than 4.5 years per priest. In 2005, Father Victor Sarrazin replaced Father Ben Somerville. Father Sarrazin saw some of our largest growth; we replaced the roof and added an Education Building, both of which have no mortgage due to an aggressive payment plan initiated by the then-treasurer.

Rev. Allison Cornell took charge of the parish in 2018 and initiated a series of church property repair and improvement projects. These include new central air conditioning, resurfaced floors, new ceiling fans, a new emergency exit door in the main church building and a complete Parish Hall kitchen remodel donated by the ECW. The interior and exterior of the sanctuary were painted. Rev. Cornell also secured the donation of an electronic organ that greatly enhanced the music for worship services and eliminated the need to raise thousands of dollars to repair our aging pipe organ. During the Covid pandemic the Columbarium was expanded.

Rev. Cornell introduced the congregation to new and more progressive services. We experimented with the women's lectionary and other contemporary versions of our standard services, prayers and hymns. She initiated activities to enhance opportunities for the congregation to reach out to the community and to engage in classes, events and involvement with each other.

In addition to the advanced age and passing of members of our congregation, the pandemic and national political divisions have been contributing factors to membership gains and, especially, losses in recent years.

We look forward to the new leadership and guidance of a Vicar who can navigate the difficult aspects of balancing Christ's teachings and our modern world. Amen!

OUR PAID STAFF

We have two ordained Deacons, Dorothy Gutwein and Sherry Simon. Our parish administrator is Mark Sowards, Daniel Garcia is our Sexton, and Doreen Oberg is the accompanist at our Sunday services. Our Bookkeeper, Sandra Calhoun as of March 2026 is a volunteer.
